**Summary:** On April 14, 2006, David Stephenson of the California-American Water Company (Cal-Am), met with Robert Lane, advisor to Cmmr. Bohn, in San Francisco. Also present were Stephen St. Marie, advisor to Cmmr. Bohn, Kevin Tilden of Cal-Am and Lori Anne Dolqueist of Steefel, Levitt & Weiss, counsel for Cal-Am. Cal-Am representatives described the potential impact on customers of the delay of a final rate case decision. Cal-Am representatives explained that this could result in a first-year increase of up to 66 percent for Felton District customers and up to 30 percent for Monterey District customers if the final decision is issued in July 2006. Cal-Am representatives also described the intentions behind its proposed conservation tiered rate design for the Monterey and Felton Districts and addressed the issue of a memorandum account to track of State Water Resources Control Board and Endangered Species Act fines for recovery from ratepayers. Finally, Cal-Am representatives discussed the ratemaking treatment of the San Clemente Dam retrofit and the Carmel River Dam.
