Summary: LATE FILED. On May 2, 2006, Erik Jacobson, Chief, Regulatory Relations, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), met with Cmmr. Peevey in San Francisco. Also present were Rami Kahlon, advisor to Cmmr. Peevey, Roy Kuga, Vice President, Energy Supply, Frank DeRosa, Director, Power Contracts, John Pappas, Manager, Electric Resource Procurement, and William Manheim, Chief Counsel, Generation, for PG&E, and Steven Kelly on behalf of the Independent Energy Producers Association (IEPA). DeRosa described some of the key terms and conditions of the PG&E-IEPA Settlement Agreement (SA) regarding QF pricing and policy. DeRosa explained that the SA applied only to QFs that voluntarily execute contract amendments and that it represented a fair compromise of the parties' positions. DeRosa stated that PG&E anticipates that savings from the SA will range from \$100-\$200 million annually. Kelly described why the SA was strongly supported by IEPA's members. Jacobson said that it was critical to obtain Commission approval of the contract amendments prior to the September 1 deadline.

Summary: AUGMENTATION REQUIRED. On May 8, 2006, Jeff Buckingham, Chief Executive Officer of Call America, Inc., met with Tim Sullivan, advisor to Cmmr. Chong, Lester Wong, advisor to Cmmr. Peevey, Kelly Hymes, advisor to Cmmr. Grueneich, Lindsay Brown, advisor to Cmmr. Bohn, and Peter Hanson, advisor to Cmmr. Brown, in five separate meetings. Also present was Glenn Stover, counsel to Call America. Buckingham and Stover explained the circumstances that led Call America, Inc., CF Communications, LLC dba Telekenex, and DMR Communications, Inc. ('small CLECs'), to file the motion for enforcement and described how SBC/AT&T's actions had directly challenged the Commission's holdings in D06-01-043. Buckingham and Stover described the devastating impact of SBC/AT&T's actions on the financial viability of the small CLECs, and how the 'proxy' resale rate set in the ALJ's ruling was the highest the small CLECs could absorb and remain in business. Buckingham and Stover explained that, unless the Commission ratified the ALJ's ruling, the Commission's goal of encouraging facilities-based competition would be further frustrated, and SBC/AT&T monopoly power in its service areas would be further strengthened.

Summary: On May 10, 2006, Michael Alcantar, counsel to the Cogeneration Association of California (CAC) and the Energy Producers and Users Coalition (EPUC), met with Pres. Peevey in San Francisco. Also present were Rami Kahlon, advisor to Pres. Peevey, and Nora Sheriff and Rod Aoki, counsel to CAC/EPUC. Written material (attached to the notice) was used. CAC/EPUC discussed the Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) and the Independent Energy Producers Association (IEP) Settlement Agreement. CAC/EPUC indicated no opposition to the approval of the settlement, but noted that it should not be characterized as precedent for any purpose related to avoided cost pricing or for long term

Qualifying Facility (QF) contract policy issues. Alcantar and Sheriff explained that the PG&E-IEP settlement did not address the need for a Commission-established long-term policy for cogeneration QFs with appropriate pricing. Alcantar discussed the necessity of long term, standard offer contracts with reasonable terms and conditions to sustain existing and encourage new cogeneration QFs. Alcantar also noted the potential deleterious impact the loss of existing cogeneration QFs and the failure to encourage new cogeneration QFs would have on Governor Schwarzenegger's Climate Action Team goals for CO2 reductions.
