The proposed decision asks the Energy Division to work with the California Independent System Operation (CAISO) and the California Energy Commission to: (1) adjust the local capacity requirements for the local areas for which deficiencies in qualified generation capacity have been identified by the CAISO; and (2) allocate local capacity requirements to individual, Commission-jurisdictional load-serving entities (LSEs), thereby establishing each LSE's local procurement obligation, using the allocation principles adopted in the decision.

The Commission's Energy Division will prepare and release a workshop agenda prior to the meeting. In addition to the items listed above, as well as any other items directed to the Energy Division in the final order, the Energy Division expects to use the meeting to discuss the 2007 Resource Adequacy Template and Guide (which will be released prior to the workshop).
