Draft Resolution Extending Authority for Vessel Common Carriers to Adjust Fares and Rates Available for Public Review and Comment

A draft resolution (TL-19080) of the Consumer Protection and Safety Division (CPSD) that extends for one year the authority granted to vessel common carriers by Resolutions TL-19042, TL-19051, and TL-19066 to adjust their passenger

Cordova described the deployment schedule and the need for rollover pre-deployment and bridge funding. Cordova explained that SDG&E's case is cost-effective for all customers and includes significant demand response benefits. Fong explained the open-architecture and other technology requirements. Fong also explained that the exemplary residential rate structure provides incentives, not penalties, and is AB 1X compliant.
