Written material (attached to the notice) was used. Smith stated that SDG&E's AMI case supports state policy goals and is cost-effective. Smith explained that differences over the analysis timeframe do not substantially impact the net present value. Smith further explained that \$85/kW is a reasonable estimate for the carrying cost of a peaker plant.
