Summary: On August 8, 2007, Jerry R. Bloom, counsel for the California Cogeneration Council (CCC) met with Nancy Ryan, advisor to Pres. Peevey in San Francisco. Also present was Andrew Swartz, advisor to Pres. Peevey. Bloom stated that the Proposed Decision (PD) would have a significantly adverse impact on existing cogenerators and the second circulated draft suffered the same problems as the first draft. Bloom emphasized that NP-15 and SP-15 market prices need to be adjusted to account for the fact that the prices in these markets are deflated and do not reflect the utilities' avoided costs. Bloom explained that language in the PD should be corrected in respect of the retrospective application of a revised SRAC formula. Bloom also stated that the time of use factors for Pacific Gas and Electric Company and San Diego Gas and Electric Company need to be adjusted at the same time as the rest of the changes to the SRAC pricing methodology are adopted.
