SCOPE OF WORKSHOP

This workshop has been prompted by energy efficiency program administrator concerns that ex-post estimates of 2006-2008 program net-to-gross ratios create uncertainty that prevents regular predictable earnings from being valued by the investment community. The utilities have been simultaneously recommending that the Commission use the utility ex-ante net-to-gross estimates to calculate program performance and shareholder earnings.

This workshop will provide an opportunity for interested parties to learn about and comment on the methodology used to estimate net-to-gross ratios for the 2004-2005 upstream lighting program and the proposed methods for estimating net-to-gross ratios for similar programs implemented during 2006-2008. The objective of the workshop is for Energy Division to take parties concerns under consideration as the evaluations of 2006-2008 programs are planned.

This workshop will not address the issue of whether or not the Commission should use utility ex-ante net-to-gross estimates to calculate program performance and shareholder earnings, nor whether or not the Commission should include participant spillover in the net-to-gross estimate for the purpose of calculating program performance and shareholder earnings.

This Resolution resolves the appeal of Field Citation 104 (FC-104), issued to Lincoln Limousine Services Inc. by the Commission's Consumer Protection and Safety Division on May 10, 2007. FC-104 was issued with a fine in the amount of \$1,250 for limousine service operations after the expiration of Commission authority and failure by Lincoln Limousine to have its employees covered under workers' compensation insurance requirements, subject to the Department of Motor Vehicles' pull notice program, and enrolled in a mandatory drug testing program.

The ALJ Division has prepared **Resolution ALJ-208** for the November 1, 2007 Agenda. In this resolution, the Commission considers the appeal by Peak Communications, Inc. (Respondent) of Third-Party Verification Citation Forfeiture No. 102 issued by the Consumer Protection and Safety Division pursuant to Resolutions UEB-001. The Citation Forfeiture alleges that Respondent failed to comply with Public Utilities Code Section 2889.5.

Based on the evidentiary record, we find that Respondent failed to confirm that the customer wanted to switch carriers. As such, Citation Forfeiture No. 102 is affirmed.
