In compliance with Public Utilities Code Section 311.5, parties who wish to subscribe to receive draft agenda items may do so by writing to the Public Utilities Commission; Attention: Poly Arca, Room 1003, 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, CA 94102, or by calling (415) 703-1798. The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. You may also order a partial agenda package (energy agenda items only or telecommunication agenda items only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting. If agenda items (including revisions) are not ready on the distribution date, they will be made available at no charge in the lobby outside the Commission Auditorium at 9:00 a.m. on the morning of the Commission meeting, but not earlier.

Summary: On May 22, 2001, Steve Rahon, Regulatory Case Manager, Sempra Energy, met, on behalf of San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) with Julie Halligan, advisor to Cmmr. Bilas, in San Francisco. Also present was Judy Peck, State Regulatory Administrator, Sempra Energy. Rahon explained that SDG&E supports the interim opinion. Rahon stated that the pro-rata curtailment of electric generation (EG) customers allows SDG&E to deliver the maximum amount of gas to its customers during curtailment events and provides reliability and operations benefits. Rahon stated that SDG&E requests that the interim order be clarified to ensure timely implementation. Rahon asserted that the pro rata curtailment of EG should apply to customers "whose units have a combined total" average usage of equal to or greater than 15 MMcfd. Rahon stated that if the Commission believes that due to electric reliability concerns this summer "peakers" should be excluded from the pro-rata curtailment of noncore firm electric generation service, then "peakers" should be clearly identified. Rahon explained further that Step II of the pro rata curtailment methodology is not needed.

Lynch, at the Law Offices of Morrison and Foster, in San Francisco. Also present were Steve Linsey, supervisor, and Darwin Farrar, staff counsel, for ORA, and Barry Goode, Esq., in his capacity as a representative of California Governor Gray Davis. The ORA representatives stated that this proceeding presented issues related to the reasonableness

of San Diego Gas & Electric Company's (SDG&E) procurement activities between July 1999 and August 2000 and managerial neglect. ORA also stated that the reasonableness of SDG&E's procurement activities after August 2000 will be an issue in the future, and that the value of the procurement contracts entered into by SDG&E prior to January 2001 is an issue in A01-01-044 and A00-10-045. The ORA representatives discussed various settlement options to resolve the proceeding.

Lynch, Anne Smith, Vice President, Customer Services and Marketing EDS of SoCalGas, Leslie Katz, Regional Vice President, State Regulatory Affairs, and Judy Peck, Regulatory Affairs Administrator, of Sempra Energy. Morrow explained that the desert area adjacent to Topock receipt point contains some environmentally sensitive regions, which would require significant environmental review prior to construction. In comparison, Morrow added that recent environmental review had been completed on a large portion of the proposed pipeline route for the Kramer Junction project, which enabled the fast tracking of that project.

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
