Subscription Notice for Draft Agenda Items

In compliance with Public Utilities Code Section 311.5, parties who wish to subscribe to receive draft agenda items may do so by writing to the Public Utilities Commission; Attention: Poly Arca, Room 1003, 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, CA 94102, or by calling (415) 703-1798. The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. You may also order a partial agenda package (energy agenda items only or telecommunication agenda items only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting. If agenda items (including revisions) are not ready on the distribution date, they will be made available at no charge in the lobby outside the Commission Auditorium at 9:00 a.m. on the morning of the Commission meeting, but not earlier.

In addition, the Commission will make draft agenda items available for viewing and photocopying (at 20 cents per page) at the Commission's Central Files Office (Room 2002), 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, and in the Los Angeles, San Diego, and Sacramento field offices. Since the agenda package will be mailed to these locations, it will be available at these locations a day or two after the distribution date. These locations will not receive agenda items that are not ready on the distribution date.

If an agenda item is held over to a subsequent Commission meeting, that agenda item and any revisions to that agenda item that were available on the morning of the initial Commission meeting (as well as any further available revisions) will be mailed in the Escutia package for the subsequent Commission meeting; the item and its revisions will also be available for viewing and photocopying in the Commission's Central Files Office and field offices as set forth above.

Stewart explained that SoCalGas believes that the projects presently under construction should be adequate to relieve the recent pressure placed on the SoCalGas system.

Summary: On July 5, 2001, Regina Birdsell, Director of the Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA), met with Cmmr. Wood in San Francisco. Also present was Jonathan Lakritz, advisor to Cmmr. Wood, and Hallie Yacknin, Assistant General Counsel, ORA. ORA representatives stated that ORA supports the draft decision and opposes the alternate. ORA explained that Pacific Bell has declined to discuss any specific objections it may have to ORA's discovery on the new regulatory framework audit based on its interpretation of D01-02-041 that bars ORA discovery prior to the commencement of a proceeding. ORA stated that the alternate does not resolve this legal

issue. ORA explained that the alternate would limit ORA's pre-proceeding discovery on the audit. 07/10/01 I01-04-002 Order Instituting Investigation whether Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), Southern California Edison Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and their respective holding companies, PG&E Corporation, Edison International, and Sempra Energy, respondents, have violated relevant statutes and Commission decisions, and whether changes should be made to rules, orders, and conditions pertaining to respondents' holding company systems.

Summary: On July 5, 2001, Joseph Malkin, attorney of Orrick, Herrington & Sutcliffe LLP, representing PG&E Corporation, met with Cmmr. Brown in San Francisco. Also present were David Gamson, advisor to Cmmr. Brown, and Shirley Woo, attorney, Pacific Gas and Electric Company. Referring to a draft decision (DD) on motions to dismiss, Malkin stated that it flawed. Malkin explained that it begins with an erroneous premise – that PG&E Corporation does not accept the validity of the Commission's holding company conditions to which it agreed. Malkin stated that PG&E Corporation does accept that those conditions are binding, but that they are contractual in nature. Malkin explained that the jurisdiction to enforce the holding company conditions rests with the courts, not with the Commission. Malkin stated that the DD's assertion that the Commission could ignore the corporations' separate identities without regard to any established principle of piercing the corporate veil was both novel and legally incorrect.
