DECISION DISMISSING COMPLAINT

Complainant seeks reparations of \$144.32 for telephone overcharges, plus costs of \$110.00 for typing, mailing, and labor.

Defendant answered, denying the allegations, but stating that it has credited complainant's account on October 29, 2008, in the amount of \$144.32, which is the billed amount in dispute. Defendant states that it has issued the credit as a courtesy to the complainant and as a means of resolving this complaint. Defendant now moves for dismissal because the disputed amount has now been credited.

We grant defendant's motion. We have no jurisdiction to award complainant's costs to bring suit. As defendant has given complainant a credit to cover the alleged overcharges, there is nothing left to decide.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Case 08-10-002 is dismissed.
2. Case 08-10-002 is closed.
