**ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S RULING DENYING
MOTION OF HAVASU LAKESHORE INVESTMENTS LLC
TO WAIVE RESPONSE PERIOD TO EMERGENCY MOTION**

Havasu Lakeshore Investments (HLI) filed an Emergency Motion for Interim Relief on July 8, 2005, and accompanied it with a request seeking to preclude Havasu Water Company (HWC) from filing a response to the motion. HLI seeks an order requiring HWC immediately to deliver 50,000 gallons a day of water to HLI's mobile home park. HLI claims the relief requested is non-controversial.

I find that the relief requested may be controversial, and that I need the benefit of HWC's response to the motion. Since the dispute has gone on for several years, and HLI concedes in its motion for interim relief that its project "will take three to five years to complete," allowing 15 days for a responsive pleading is in the public interest.

IT IS RULED that Havasu Lakeshore Investment's Motion to Waive Period to Emergency Motion, filed July 8, 2005, is denied. Havasu Water Company may respond to the Motion for Interim Relief on or before July 25, 2005.
