An accompanying declaration under penalty of perjury shall also be submitted setting forth all the reasons for the late submission.

**Summary: LATE FILED.** On December 6, 2004, Bruce C. Foster, Vice President, Regulatory Affairs of Southern California Edison Company (SCE), met with Julie Fitch, advisor to Pres. Peevey, in San Francisco. Also present were Colin E. Cushnie, Director of Regulatory Affairs of SCE, and Sheryl Carter, Director of Western Energy Programs of the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC). Written material (attached to the notice) was used. SCE's representatives expressed concern regarding the proposed decision's (PD) adoption of a greenhouse gas (GHG) bid evaluation adder for all of SCE's procurement activity. SCE expressed that with a change in the decision to the application of the GHG adder, it will support the PD's GHG adder policy. SCE stated that SCE and NRDC now support a change to the PD that would apply the GHG adder to evaluation of new utility commitments or contracts with terms greater than five years. SCE encouraged a revision to the PD to indicate that the Commission was going to seek a much broader application of GHG considerations. SCE expressed a willingness to work at the legislature to develop a more board-based carbon policy. SCE's representatives expressed concern that the final decision on SCE's long-term procurement plan not preclude the continuation of SCE's current solicitation for multi-year electrical capacity. SCE's representatives stated that all utility customers should be responsible for stranded costs through a non-bypassable wires charge for contracts that SCE enters into for the benefit of all customers or for grid reliability.

**Summary: LATE FILED.** On December 2, 2004, Mona Tierney, Director of Government Affairs of Constellation NewEnergy, Inc. (CNE), also representing Strategic Energy, L.L.C. (Strategic), met with David Gamson, advisor to Cmmr. Brown, in San Francisco. Also present was Mary Lynch of Constellation Energy Commodities Group formerly known as Constellation Power Source (CPS). Tierney discussed the proposed decision (PD) of ALJ Brown. Tierney articulated Strategic and CNE's concerns that the utilities have 'under-forecasted' potential load migration due to the development of community choice aggregation and re-opening of the direct access market, that the utilities will overprocure as a result, and that the PD authorizes the utilities to impose exit fees on departing customers to recover their stranded costs. Tierney also discussed CPS' 'slice of load' proposal as a means of addressing future stranded costs concerns.

**Summary:** On December 15, 2004, Devra Bachrach, Staff Scientist at the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC), met with Brian Prusnek, advisor to Cmmr. Kennedy, in San Francisco. Bachrach discussed NRDC's support for the draft decision's (DD) proposed 'greenhouse gas (GHG) adder'. Bachrach requested that the Commission clarify that the 'GHG adder' represents the financial risk associated with carbon emissions, and is not an externality value.
