ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S RULING ON FIRST WORKSHOP ISSUES PAPER AND NOTICE OF ENERGY DIVISION WORKSHOP

The August 9, 2010 Administrative Law Judge's Ruling on Phase 2 of Rulemaking (R.) 09-08-009 set forth the issues and schedule for Phase 2 of this proceeding. The ruling set a schedule for workshops to address Phase 2 issues and indicated Energy Division would prepare Options Papers (referred to herein as Workshop Issues Papers) on identified topic areas. The purpose of each Workshop Issues Paper is to review the existing record on a topic, provide preliminary analysis, and develop discussion questions to focus party comments.

A Workshop Issues Paper entitled "*PEV Metering Arrangements & The Utility Role in Supporting Vehicle Charging*" is attached to this ruling. This Workshop Issues Paper will be discussed at the September 27, 2010 workshop, which will commence at 10 a.m. and be held in the Commission's Auditorium.

Parties may file comments in response to the specific questions listed at the conclusion of the attached Workshop Issues Paper within 15 days of the date of this ruling. Comments must be served and filed with the Commission's

Docket Office. Comments must be filed electronically with the Docket Office and served via electronic mail on the official service list for this proceeding. Consult the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure for further instructions.

The attached Workshop Issues Paper includes questions related the point of demarcation or boundary between the utility and its customer and issues relating to second meter or submeter connection to third party data management systems and/or utility Advanced Meter Initiative (e.g., Smart Meter) network. Party responses related to Smart Meter network may be cited and discussed further in subsequent Workshop Issues Papers. In comments, parties may raise utility role issues in addition to the questions set forth in the Workshop Issues Paper but are specifically requested to respond to questions included therein.

In addition, utility role issues considered in this Workshop Issues Paper and potentially additional issues may be discussed at the September 27, 2010 workshop. Utility role issues in the provision of direct charging management services and related issues will also be addressed in a subsequent Energy Division Workshop Issues Paper and workshop in November.

IT IS RULED that:

1. Comments on the attached Workshop Issues Paper shall be filed with the Commission's Docket Office within 15 days.
2. An Energy Division workshop will be held on September 27, 2010 at 10 a.m. in the Commission Auditorium.
