#### MOTION OF THE NATIONAL DIVERISTY COALITION FOR PARTY STATUS

#### I. INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to Rule 1.4(a)(4) of the California Public Utilities Commission's ("CPUC" or "Commission") Rules of Practice and Procedure, the National Diversity Coalition<sup>1</sup> ("NDC") hereby respectfully request to be granted party status in the above captioned proceeding.

Pursuant to Rule 1.4(b), NDC provides a statement of the entities and interests we represent and a statement of factual and legal contentions.

#### II. BACKGROUND AND STATEMENT OF INTEREST

The National Diversity Coalition is a coalition of non-profit organizations, churches, minority business chambers, and other community-based organizations that serve the minority community, which is predominantly low-income. On behalf of low-income minority ratepayers and small business owners, NDC advocates before State and Federal regulatory and legislative agencies. The mission of NDC is to promote greater economic equality for underserved people

NDC brings to the discussion in these proceedings the voice and concerns of minority

ratepayers, who make up the majority of California's population and who look to the

Commission to protect them from unreasonable increases in the costs of essential utility services

and to implement meaningful programs to improve utility safety, efficiency, and reliability.

NDC provides a unique grassroots perspective, gained from providing direct services in low-

income minority communities, which will aid the Commission's decision making process.

III. FACTUAL AND LEGAL CONTENTIONS

NDC intends to be an active party in this proceeding.

At this early stage, NDC has not determined exactly what factual and legal contentions

we intend to make. However, our analyses and contentions will be limited to the scope

established in the OIR and any subsequent scoping memo. Our intention is to provide analysis,

insight, and recommendations regarding how different financing options will impact adoption of

clean energy among low-income minority communities.
