Decision PROPOSED DECISION OF ALJ FERGUSON (Mailed 2/12/2021)

BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY (U-60-W), a California corporation, for an order (1) authorizing it to increase rates for water service by \$50,673,500 or 7.6% in test year 2020, (2) authorizing it to increase rates on January 1, 2021 by \$31,461,900 or 4.4% and on January 1, 2022 \$33,000,700 or 4.4% in accordance with the Rate Case Plan, and (3) adopting other related rulings and relief necessary to implement the Commission's ratemaking policies.

DECISION MODIFYING ORDERING PARAGRAPHS 24 AND 25 OF DECISION 20-12-007

Summary

This decision modifies Ordering Paragraphs 24 and 25 of Decision 20-12-007 to clarify the limit on the number of advanced metering infrastructure installations California Water Service Company may make in the aggregate in three of its water districts, Bear Gulch, Los Altos and Redwood Valley.

The proceeding is closed.

1. Background

On December 3, 2020, Decision (D.) 20-12-007 was issued resolving the general rate case proceeding for California Water Service Company (Cal Water) covering years 2020 – 2022.

On December 22, 2020, Cal Water submitted a letter request pursuant to California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) Rules of Practice and Procedure, Rule 16.6, to the Commission's Executive Director seeking clarification of the wording of Ordering Paragraphs (OPs) 24 and 25 of D.20-12-007, on the ground that the text of D.20-12-007 on page 41¹ conflicted with the text of OPs 24 and 25.² Each of those OPs refers to the maximum, aggregated number of Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) devices that D.20-12-007 allows Cal Water to install during the current rate cycle in the Bear Gulch, Los Altos and Redwood Valley districts. Cal Water recommended modifications to the OPs to eliminate the ambiguity and inconsistency.

By a letter to Cal Water dated January 8, 2021, the Executive Director declined to make the requested modifications to OPs 24 and 25, and instead, she referred the matter to Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) for resolution.

2. Discussion and Analysis

Upon review of D.20-12-007, we find that ambiguity and inconsistency exist and Cal Water's requested modifications to OPs 24 and 25 are justified. By

modifying Ordering Paragraphs 24 and 25 of D.20-12-007, as reflected below, the ambiguity and inconsistency will be eliminated:

- 24. California Water Service Company is authorized to continue with the installation of advanced metering infrastructure at customer locations in Bear Gulch, Los Altos and Redwood Valley districts, so long as the total number of installations systemwide across those three districts does not exceed one percent of its customer count systemwide and does not exceed \$2.92 million in cost.
- 25. California Water Service Company may install advanced meter infrastructure equipment at its customers' locations in Portola Valley, so long as the total number of installations systemwide-across the Bear Gulch, Los Altos and Redwood Valley districts does not exceed one percent of its customer count systemwide and does not exceed \$2.92 million in cost.

We therefore order that these modifications be made.

Findings of Fact

1. The text on page 41 of D.20-12-007 and the wording of OPs 24 and 25 of the same decision are inconsistent and create ambiguity.

2. Modifying OPs 24 and 25 as ordered in this decision will avoid all

inconsistency and ambiguity.

Conclusion of Law

1. The Commission should modify OPs 24 and 25 of D.20-12-007 to eliminate inconsistency and ambiguity in D.20-12-007.

2. This proceeding should be closed.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Ordering Paragraph 24 of Decision 20-12-007 shall be modified to read as follows:

24. California Water Service Company is authorized to continue with the installation of advanced metering infrastructure at customer locations in Bear Gulch, Los Altos and Redwood Valley districts, so long as the total number of installations across those three districts does not exceed one percent of its customer count systemwide and does not exceed \$2.92 million in cost.

2. Ordering Paragraph 25 of Decision 20-12-007 shall be modified to read as

follows:

25. California Water Service Company may install advanced meter infrastructure equipment at its customers' locations in Portola Valley, so long as the total number of installations across the Bear Gulch, Los Altos and Redwood Valley districts does not exceed one percent of its customer count systemwide and does not exceed \$2.92 million in cost. 3. This proceeding is closed.
