Judge Toy:

This email concerns Complaint 20-12-005, Fenner v. PG&E. In advance of our prehearing conference on Friday, March 8th, I would like to relate a development that may impact the proceeding.

Since filing the Complaint, PG&E and Mr. Fenner have continued attempts to find a mutually agreeable settlement. It now appears that Mr. Fenner may be comfortable signing an Interconnection Agreement that is currently pending before the CPUC. Once he is able to do so, Mr. Fenner would be willing to withdraw the Complaint.

To be more specific, PG&E is currently awaiting approval of a new Interconnection Agreement, Form 79-1193-02, as part of Advice Letter 5938-E. Mr. Fenner would be eligible to use this new agreement, once approved. The new agreement does not include certain sections that Mr. Fenner requested revisions to as part of his Complaint. As mentioned above, Advice Letter 5938-E is still under review with the CPUC, though PG&E has received no concerns regarding Form 79-1193-02.

Therefore, PG&E and Mr. Fenner respectfully request that his Complaint be placed on hold until Advice Letter 5938-E is approved and Mr. Fenner is able to sign Form 79-1193-02. At that time, Mr. Fenner would withdraw his Complaint. In the alternative, if Mr. Fenner were allowed to sign Form 79-1193-02 while the Advice Letter is pending, Mr. Fenner could immediately withdraw his Complaint.

Mr. Fenner and I remain available to discuss this matter further at this Friday's prehearing conference. If you would prefer to postpone the prehearing conference in light of these developments, we would support that approach as well.
