ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S RULING SETTING PUBLIC PARTICIPATION HEARINGS AND RELATED INSTRUCTIONS

This ruling sets the time and date for two remote public participation hearings (PPHs) in the Order Instituting Investigation to address the potential loss of natural gas service for a portion of the Santa Nella, California community. The PPHs are scheduled for February 15, 2023, at 2:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. The PPHs are an opportunity for the public, including the impacted community in Santa Nella, California, to communicate directly with the Commission regarding the issues raised in this proceeding.

Written public comments may also be provided at any time during the proceeding using the "Add Public Comment" button on the "Public Comment" tab of the Docket Cards for these proceedings.

2. Instructions to Observe

Anyone may observe the PPHs via the webcast information provided above.

3. Directives to Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) and Any Other Party that Would Like to Present at the PPHs

PG&E Company shall prepare the name, title, and telephone number of at least one PG&E senior customer service representative who can be reached by customers during the hearings for individual service or billing issues. A PG&E representative must also be prepared to respond to specific questions about material in PG&E filings in this proceeding. PG&E shall provide this information to the Public Advisor's Office no later than seven days before the PPHs. This information may be posted for the public during the hearings.

PG&E is directed to prepare a brief presentation, which shall be no longer than five minutes on their positions and analysis of the options for replacement service discussed in the proceeding. Any other party is permitted to provide a five minute presentation as well - please alert the Service List no later than February 8, 2023 if any party other than PG&E seeks to make a presentation on their position of the options in the proceeding.

Parties shall provide by email to the Service List by February 8, 2023, with the name, position, e-mail, and phone number of the individual who will be conducting the presentations. If the parties will be using a script at the PPHs they shall also include a copy of the script. Any slides used in the presentation shall be provided concurrently when submitting the name of the of the individual conducting the presentation. Please provide the materials by February 8, 2023 in Microsoft PowerPoint (preferred), Microsoft Word, or PDF format.

4. Procedural Instructions Regarding the Remote PPH

The court reporters will be relying on the audio from the Verizon

telephone system, and not WebEx, to transcribe the PPH. To ensure a complete

and accurate record, participants should comply with the following instructions:

• Speakers must identify themselves before speaking each

time and state and spell their name the first time that they

speak;

Speakers must speak slowly, clearly, and one at a time; and

• Speakers should pause between statements during the

PPH.

As this this an audio and video remote PPH which relies on technology to

relay statements in verbatim format by those in attendance to the court reporter,

(1) the reporter will be interrupting the speakers, if necessary, when there is/are

inaudible statement(s) or portions thereof, and (2) the reporter will be inserting

the word "inaudible" in the transcript when there is dropped, garbled, or

otherwise indecipherable audio.
