PART I: PROCEDURAL ISSUES (to be completed by Intervenor except where indicated)

A. Brief description of Decision:	In D.21-08-037 , the Commission adopted interim rate relief rules for incarcerated person's calling services. The Commission adopted an interim rate cap of seven cents (\$0.07) per minute for debit, prepaid calls, and collect calls (Interim Rate Cap). The Commission also prohibited ancillary fees for these services, with one exception; permitted
	government taxes with no markup; and prohibited the imposition of any

other type of ancillary fee or service not explicitly approved by the Decision. The Commission also ordered service providers to file proof of compliance within 45 days of issuance of the Decision.
In D.22-08-038 , the Commission denied two providers' applications for rehearing of D.21-08-037, filed by Securus and NCIC.
In <i>Securus Technologies, LLC v. Public Utilities Com.</i> , No. B320207, the California Court of Appeals, 2 nd district affirmed D.21-08-037. <i>Securus Technologies, LLC v. 1. Background		
The Commission opened this proceeding on its own to address for the first time, the rates for telecommunication services provided to incarcerated and detained people in the State. In 2013, the FCC adopted rules to establish rates for interstate and intrastate incarcerated phone calling services. 2017, the DC Circuit court struck down the FCC rate regulation for intrastate incarcerated phone calling services as beyond the FCC's jurisdiction. This created a regulatory gap for intrastate incarcerated phone calling services, including in California. Subsequently, at the FCC's encouragement for states to address intrastate services, the Commission's work commenced with this proceeding with a "rulemaking [to] build[] on work by the [FCC] to regulate interstate inmate communications services."

The Commission recognized that this was a novel issue and strongly encouraged active fact-finding and work with stakeholders with more experience in this field as reflected below in this claim. Many advocates for incarcerated calling services ("subject matter champions" as referred to in this claim) and service providers involved in this proceeding are generally not active participants in Commission processes.

The Commission bifurcated this proceeding into two phases, with the possibility of more phases in the future. Phase I of this proceeding set out to define inmate communication services, examine market competition, and provide interim rate relief for incarcerated communications services. Phase 1 decisions focused on phone calling services and ancillary fees. The Commission issued a decision providing interim relief for incarcerated communication services in D.21-08-037.

2. Need for Regulation

The Commission asked whether it should look to FCC regulations "to inform the Commission's approach to [incarcerated person's calling] services." At several stages in the proceeding, TURN urged the Commission to act independently of the FCC's precedent and to determine a solution that addressed the needs in California. Specifically, TURN "encourage[d] the Commission to take a thoughtful review of both the federal level developments and the [incarcerated person's calling services] market needs in California."

The Commission agreed that it should act independently of the FCC and adopted interim rates based on the record of this proceeding. (*see below* discussion in category, Rates for Interim Relief)

Moreover, in a Staff Proposal, the Commission Staff found that "rates being charged to [incarcerated persons] in California to be unreasonable" and "are offered on a monopoly basis." TURN "urge[d] the Commission to analyze [incarcerated person's calling] services as they have historically been provided so that it can craft meaningful and workable long-term solutions to the market failures and inequities that have plagued this industry for decades." TURN supported the Staff Proposal's conclusions and encouraged the Commission to find there has been a market failure and therefore a need for regulation. TURN further urged the Commission to consider among several elements, the view of the end-user, the need for relief even when the may later examine at the competitive bidding market.

In D.21-08-037, the Commission found there was a market failure, high and varied rates for the services across the state, and grounds to regulate the rates for incarcerated person's calling services.

Subsequently, in response to the Applications for Rehearing for D.21-08- 037, TURN (and Joint Consumers) demonstrated in great detail that the Commission's market analysis, including its definition of the relevant market, and conclusion of market failure, was supported by substantial evidence in light of the whole record. Moreover, TURN (and Joint Consumers) rebutted provider arguments that the Commission was required to determine the level of competition in the contract bidding market prior to determining whether caller rates were unjust and unreasonable. 4. Jurisdiction – Internet Protocol- based and Video Calling Services		
TURN advocated that the Commission should interpret its jurisdiction broadly over incarcerated person's calling services. The Commission generally agreed and held that "[t]elephone corporations providing [incarcerated person's calling services] voice services, including VoIP [Voice over Internet Protocol] technologies, are public utilities subject to [the Commission's] jurisdiction." The Commission adopted interim rules that applied to "intrastate incarcerated person's voice calling services." TURN also urged the Commission to include video calling services in its review and regulation of incarcerated person's calling services and refer to material in the record for these services provided by other parties. Such regulation is especially important given providers' "comments that changes will be made to encourage incarcerated [persons] to use non-regulated services [. by] mak[ing] voice communications inaccessible" However, the Staff Proposal stated that the Commission Staff "did not have the necessary relative pricing data to determine the reasonableness of these and other non- voice communications services rates." 5. Jurisdiction – "Jurisdictionally Mixed" Communications		
TURN advocated for the Commission "to establish regulatory boundaries [by] request[ing] comments regarding how the industry currently determines 'call end point' locations and whether there are alternative ways of distinguishing interstate and intrastate calling to ensure California detainees and their families are protected." TURN explained that the FCC's most recent decision reiterated the state's ability to regulate, and that federal FCC action operated as a "ceiling" but that states may require "lower rates or fees, even in jurisdictionally mixed services." TURN also recommended that in addition to prisons and jails at the state and county level, the Commission should consider service providers that serve other types of detention facilities, including those that house immigrant populations either through federal contracts with private facilities, or state or local facilities. TURN supported the Scoping Memo's broad definition of facilities and technologies for the purposes of defining incarcerated person's calling services. 8. Ancillary Services Fees		
At the outset of the proceeding, TURN urged "the Commission should study the various ancillary fees charged for all the calling options referenced in the OIR," and that the Commission "should determine the impact of these fees on [incarcerated person's calling] service affordability to ensure that these fees do not increase rates, thereby addressing rates that are not 'just and reasonable."" Specifically, TURN recommended that "the Commission should study single- call service fees, automated payment service fees, third party fees, live agent fees, and paper bill fees, as well as late payment fees for calls that service providers identify as intrastate." 11. Equity

TURN supported a broad review in this proceeding so that the Commission may review and understand the possible racial divisions, inequities and discriminatory impacts the current business practices and unreasonable rates, terms, and conditions have on low-income families. communities of color, limited English speaking consumers and other vulnerable populations. TURN argued that the rate structure perpetuates disparities for communities of color, for example in the African American community. TURN recommended for the proposed decision to integrate equity-conscious framework throughout in furtherance of the Commission's ESJ Action Plan.

The Commission generally agreed and acknowledged that the providers' unreasonable rates for calling services disproportionately affect people of color. The Commission further explained that the decision advances the Commission's ESJA Plan goals by "affirming the importance of just and reasonable rates for calling services for the incarcerated and their families, who are disproportionately represented by people of color in California, particularly Black Californians."

Public Participation Hearings

In the interest of having the Commission hear directly from people affected by the issues in this proceeding, TURN advocated for the Commission to hold public participation hearings in this proceeding. Specifically, "TURN strongly urge[d] the Commission to provide opportunities to hear directly from these families, including those

formerly incarcerated, and other advocacy groups that represent adult and minor detainees to understand first-hand the crisis created by the business practices of these service providers." As reflected in the claim attachments, TURN proactively worked with Commission staff to enhance the Commission's logistics and settings to facilitate the participation without fear of retaliation or retribution. from individuals detained or incarcerated and their families, in furtherance to develop the administrative record for the proceeding about these novel services to the Commission.

In response, the Commission held two public participation hearings with extra precautions to protect "the anonymity and prioritization of incarcerated persons providing verbal comment during public hearings and/ or providing written comment on the Commission's public comment web portal." In its decision to adopt interim rules, the Commission relied on the experiences of the persons who provided public comment as evidence of the effect of the exorbitant calling rates on persons who are incarcerated and their families.

In-Language

TURN urged the Commission to require providers offer in-language support for terms and conditions, bills, and other contractual verbiage. The Commission agreed and modified its proposed decision to requires provider offer inlanguage support for people who are incarcerated or detained and their families. • See TURN Claim Attachment 6.

records reflect, and as further described in section below (section III.A.a. "coordination" discussion), TURN advocates met with and provided technical assistance to subject matter champions that were new to the Commission and the Commission process to participate and file pleadings in this proceeding. See e.g., Californians for Jail and Prison Phone Justice Coalition OIR Opening Comments (Nov. 9, 2020); Root and Rebound OIR Opening Comments (Nov. 9, 2020); Prison Policy Initiative OIR Reply Comments (Nov. 19, 2020). This coordination avoided unnecessary duplication of efforts by facilitating the subject matter champions' expertise shared with the Commission and by also relying on this information instead of attempting to recreate field studies or conducting the same qualitative analysis. TURN provided unique contributions to the discussion that were covered in a more limited way by other intervenors. For example, TURN wrote extensively throughout Phase 1 about the Commission's jurisdiction over Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) and IP-enabled services that facilitate communication services for incarcerated persons. *See* TURN OIR Opening Comments at 13-15 (Nov. 9, 2020); TURN OIR Reply Comments at 2-4 (Nov. 19, 2020)(responding to arguments that the Commission lacks jurisdiction); TURN Staff Proposal Opening Comments at 8, 9, 11 (Apr. 30, 2021); TURN Staff Proposal Reply Comments at 2-3, 12-13, 16 (May 12, 2021))(responding to arguments that the Commission lacks jurisdiction); TURN Opening Brief at 1, 3-4 (Aug. 2, 2021).

Other Intervenors. Although TURN coordinated or discussed some issues with other intervenors, TURN independently contributed unique approaches and proposals for the Commission to consider as it determined the rates and fees for communications services for incarcerated persons in California. For example, TURN recommended an approach for rates for voice services (percentage reduction that reflected intrastate services) that was different than other intervenors. *Compare* TURN Staff Proposal Opening Comments at 11-12 (suggesting a 30 percent reduction from the FCC rate, approximately 9 cents per minute) *with* Californians for Jail and Prison Phone Justice Coalition Staff Proposal Reply Comments at 4 (May 12, 2021)(suggesting several approaches under 9 cents per minute and a set of free calls), Cal Advocates Staff Proposal Comment at 7 (suggesting a 5 cents per minute); CforAT Staff Proposal Comment at 7 (suggesting adopting the FCC new rate but provide a set of free calls) and CforAT Staff Reply Comment at 7 (supporting Cal

Advocates' proposal of 5 cents per minute). The Commission distinguishes the proposals in its decision. D.21-08-037 at 46-49.

Cal Advocates. TURN coordinated with Cal Advocates to discuss several issues unique to this proceeding but ultimately, filed independently and offered policy positions that were different in some ways from Cal Advocates' positions. For example, on the issue of ancillary fees for these communication services, TURN's proposal recommended a percentage reduction from the current FCC method but to keep the types of fees that the FCC approach used, while Cal Advocates suggested to reduce the types of fees allowed altogether. The Commission compares the various approaches in its decision. *See* D.21-08-037 at 65-69 (discussing Cal Advocates' ancillary fees proposal), at 69-70 (discussing TURN's ancillary fees proposal).

A second example is that TURN supported the inclusion of video calling services in the Commission's Phase I decision; Cal Advocates advocated that video calling services should be considered not in Phase 1 but in the Phase 2. *Compare* TURN Staff Proposal Opening Comments 8-9 (Apr. 30, 2021)(supporting the inclusion of video calling services in Phase 1), TURN Staff Proposal Reply Comments 11-12 (May 12, 2021), TURN Proposed Decision Opening Comments at 3-5 (Aug. 2, 2021) *with* Cal Advocates Staff Proposal Opening Comments at 13-14 (Apr. 30, 2021)(suggesting that video calling services be considered in Phase 2) and Cal Advocates Proposed Decision Opening Comments at 4-5 (Aug. 2, 2021); Cal Advocates Proposed Decision Reply Comments at 4-5 (Aug. 9, 2021)(recognizing TURN's video calling service approach).

A third and fourth examples are that TURN advocated for equity considerations and in-language consumer education, but Cal Advocates did not raise these issues. *Compare* TURN Proposed Decision Opening Comments at 5-11 (Aug. 2, 2021); *with* Cal Advocates Proposed Decision Opening Comments (Aug. 2, 2021); Cal Advocates Proposed Decision Reply Comments (Aug. 9, 2021).

Joint Response to Application for Rehearing. TURN worked closely with Prison Policy Initiative and CforAT to draft a joint response to the Applications for Rehearing of D. 21-08-037 filed by NCIC and Securus. This coalition allowed TURN to maximize its substantial contributions in the response and avoid duplication of effort. The coalition discussed and assigned different issues to each organization where possible, split up the drafting and research efforts, and assigned one organization to coordinate the work effort. TURN drafted the portions related to rates and takings analysis, Prison Policy Initiative drafted the portions about ancillary fees and site

 commissions, and CforAT drafted the portions about market power and interference with contracts. PART III: REASONABLENESS OF REQUESTED COMPENSATION (to be completed by Intervenor except where indicated)

A. General Claim of Reasonableness (§ 1801 and § 1806):

CPUC Discussion

a. Intervenor's claim of cost reasonableness:

TURN's request for intervenor compensation seeks an award of approximately \$304,828.75 as the reasonable cost for participation in the proceeding. Considering the scope and quality of TURN's work, and the breadth and depth of benefits achieved through TURN's participation in the proceeding, the Commission should have little trouble concluding that the amount requested is reasonable.

The Commission's review of incarcerated person's calling services was an issues of first impression, with many components that were novel before the Commission, and it has implications of service to some of California's most vulnerable residents. For example, the Commission's work on this proceeding built upon the work already done at the Federal Communications Commission and judicial orders and was influenced by work done in other states. For another example, the Commission found that the status quo for incarcerated person's calling services caused significant harms to people who are low-income and disproportionally harmed people of color. Prior to the Commission's adoption of interim rules in this proceeding, incarcerated person's calling services providers charged varying yet exorbitant prices, resulting in incarcerated persons and their family members going into debt to stay in touch. Yet, staying connected with loved once reduced the rate of recidivism. TURN's advocacy focused on bolstering the Commission's jurisdiction to regulate rates and require consumer protections for incarcerated person's calling services

As is often the case for telecommunications proceedings in recent years, it is more difficult to quantify the dollar impacts of TURN's work here than is the case in Commission proceedings addressing rates. Here, TURN's advocacy helped achieve benefits that were clear and substantial, though hard to quantify. As discussed above, TURN's efforts resulted in important interim relief for individuals incarcerated or detained and their families through the adoption of significantly lower voice calling rates and limited fees for incarcerated calling services for the first time in California. TURN's efforts also resulted in some important in-language requirements that should be helpful for end users. This relief and the associated protections will provide direct financial benefits to these consumers, particularly in ESJ communities. Similarly, the efficient compliance requirements and notification measures adopted should help to ensure the companies' compliance the rules, and thus increase the likelihood that the intended public benefits will be realized. TURN submits that such outcomes demonstrate benefits to incarcerated and detained individuals and their families that, though difficult to quantify, more than support a compensation award in the amount requested here.

Therefore, TURN urges the Commission to find that TURN's participation	
costs are reasonable considering the significant consumer benefits from the	
adopted interim relief for incarcerated calling services.	
b. Reasonableness of hours claimed:	
TURN seeks compensation for approximately 472 hours that Brenda D.	
Villanueva devoted to substantive issues in this proceeding. Mrs.	
Villanueva was TURN's lead attorney on almost all issues in this	
proceeding, including the novel issues pertaining incarcerated persons	
calling services, which was an topic of first impression before the	
Commission. To inform TURN's advocacy on these novel issues, Mrs.	
Villanueva necessarily undertook research on communications services	
provided in California, which required research on the regulatory,	
legislative, and judicial ecosystem for communications services adopted or	
considered at the federal level by the Federal Communications Commission and in other states.	
Moreover, Mrs. Villanueva was the lead attorney to draft and negotiate	
nondisclosure agreements and data request, and to review responses to data	
requests submitted by TURN or other advocates. Mrs. Villanueva analyzed the rulings and staff proposal in this phase and was the primary	
drafter for TURN's comments, under the supervision of Ms. Mailloux,

She also facilitated intervenor compensation workshop for subject matter champions that wished to participate in the CPUC Intervenor Compensation program in furtherance of their active advocacy in this proceeding given the OIR's goal to invite these stakeholders.

TURN seeks compensation for approximately 48 hours for TURN Organizing and Advocacy Campaign Director Jorge Rivera to research and to identify champions with a considerable knowledge of communications services for incarcerated persons in California prisons, jails, detention centers, and other carceral institutions. Mr. Rivera's research and identification was instrumental in informing TURN's work and positions on the issues of first impression before the Commission and allowed TURN to be a resource to the Communications Division Staff in this proceeding. The Commission recognized that the services subjected to this proceeding were issues of first impressions. As a result, TURN needed to efficiently conduct research efforts to learn about the various communications service issues for incarcerated persons and that the best path forward was to bring expert subject matter experts to the Commission, groups with real-world experience. TURN provides two examples below.

For example, at the request of Communications Division staff, Mr. Rivera identified subject matter champions and secured meeting dates with Communications Division staff to discuss communication services in juvenile facilities and in adult facilities on January 25, 2021, and January 26, 2021, respectively. Mr. Rivera drafted a proposed agenda and facilitated meeting logistics to efficiently create a setting for Communication Division staff to learn from subject matter champion in each of the areas that staff identified. *See* TURN Claim Attachment 5. This effort facilitated a real-time dialogue about issues such as access to counsel, service reliability, and payment and billing structures for communications services for incarcerated persons in California facilities. This dialogue saved Communications Division staff and TURN advocates' time and resources.

Another example, Mr. Rivera's efforts to identify and facilitate subject matter expertise in the carceral system process was an instrumental in establishing a fairer process for incarcerated persons currently in California carceral facilities to fully participate in the proceeding's two-day public participation hearings. Through Mr. Rivera's collaboration with other champions, he identified privacy, safety, and accessibility concerns and raised them with the Commission in time to revise the public participation hearing instructions and establish a path in which the identity of callers who feared retribution for offering public participation testimony, could be protected. *See* TURN Claim Attachment 6. This direct contribution can be examined by the many public participation participants that joined the public participation hearings over the course of two days. Over 90 people provided testimonials during the two-day conference, ten of the participants identified themselves as currently or formerly incarcerated. *See* D.21-08-037 at pp. 11-12, 14-15. The Commission's decision cites to these testimonials as did many parties. *See* D.21-08-037 at pp. 11-12, 14-15, 73, TURN Opening Comments to Staff Proposal at pp. 6, 15, 18 (April 30, 2022); TURN Reply Comments to Staff Proposal at pp. 2, 4, 9, 14, 17 (May 12, 2021); Public Advocates Reply Comments to Staff Proposal at p. 3 (May 12, 2021).

TURN seeks compensation for approximately 25 hours dedicated by TURN Organizing Director Constance Slider Pierre in this proceeding. Due to the nature of the issues of first impression in this proceeding and the need to work with a myriad of champions to inform TURN's work in the proceeding, TURN found it necessary for Ms. Slider Pierre to support Mr. Rivera's work in this proceeding, as described in the examples above and shown in TURN Claim Attachments 5 and 6.

TURN Director of Race and Equity Gabriela Sandoval dedicated only a few hours to help equity issues, such as elements to support more action in furtherance of the Commission's ESJ Action Plan and in-language requirements in response to the proposed decision.

TURN Telecom Staff Attorney Ashley Salas dedicated only a few hours to help with the compensation request.

Research

As the Commission recognized in the October 19, 2020, Order Instituting Rulemaking (OIR), the Commission has not previously regulated the rates of telephone services for incarcerated persons in California prisons and jails and has not reviewed the contracts for these services. *See* OIR at 4-6. These communications services provided in these carceral settings are novel issues for the Commission. In fact, the Commission acknowledged that its work here would build off prior work by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), and the approaches seen in other states. *See* OIR at pp. 4-6; Scoping Memo at pp. 1-3, 11-18 (discussing FCC); and 18-19 (discussing states). The Scoping Memo directly sought comment on whether the "FCC regulations over interstate and international calls [should] inform the Commission's approach to intrastate inmate communication services" and whether the Commission should "use some elements of FCC orders but not others as models for ensuring just and

reasonable, and affordable, inmate communication services rates in California." Scoping Memo at 25 (Phase I question 4).

Therefore, to comprehensively advocate for reasonable solutions for California, TURN advocates reviewed FCC precedent establishing rules and rates for calling services for incarcerated persons, and the FCC's various information collection materials. *See* FCC, Rates for Interstate Inmate Calling Services Rates for Interstate Inmate Calling Services, WC Docket No. 12-375. Both sets of FCC workstreams required TURN advocates to have familiarity of more than seven years of FCC decisions and a DC Circuit court opinion, some of which changed during the course of the Commission's Phase 1 work. *See e.g.* FCC, Rates for Interstate Inmate Calling Services Rates for Interstate Inmate Calling Services, Third Report and Order, Order on Reconsideration, and Fifth Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, WC Docket No. 12-375, FCC 21-60 (FCC 2021).

Relatedly, the Commission's OIR and the proceeding's Scoping Memo recognized the importance of the work completed or considered in the California legislature and in other states to address the high rates and costs for communication services for incarcerated persons. *See* OIR at p. 4; Scoping Memo at 3-4. Therefore, TURN advocates researched the solutions considered in the California Legislature and in other states to address the rates for communications services for incarcerated persons. TURN found legislative, regulatory, and other means to address rates for these communication services as a result of the research.

Consequently, to understand these novel concepts, to review the sources referenced by the Commission, and to address the questions in rulings, TURN advocates researched California legislation, other states' legislation and regulation, FCC rules in its ongoing proceeding, and judicial decisions. Time for this research is coded as RES.

Coordination

As referenced in the "research" discussion above, the communications services for incarcerated persons are novel issues for the Commission. The structure for these services has largely operated through a separate set of state or local agencies via bids and contracts and not the Commission. However, champions for communications services for incarcerated persons have a chaptered history of serving incarcerated persons and their families in California and an intimate knowledge of communications services for these families in various carceral settings in California-prisons, jails, detention centers, court jails, minor-serving institutions, among others. Other champions have knowledge of these services and how they are reviewed or regulated in other states. In addition to these champions serving as a resource to inform TURN's work, TURN worked with Communications Division to bring these champions' knowledge-base of communication services for incarcerated persons into the record of the Commission's proceeding. A significant number of these champions had no experience with the Commission or the Commission's rulemaking process. Therefore, TURN's organizing team coordinated the targeted and repeated outreach and education efforts throughout the course of this phase for these champions to inform the Commission's record. See TURN Claim Attachments 5 and 6. The TURN policy team provided process guidance at various stages of this phase and as a result, facilitated the party status and active involvement of several champions with little to no experience with Commission process. See e.g., Root and Rebound OIR Opening Comments (Nov. 9, 2020); Returning Home Foundation Motion for Party Status (Dec. 8, 2020). Moreover, at the request of the Administrative Law Judge, TURN served as a resource for new and interested intervenors and conducted a special curated training for interested champions to participate in the Commission's Intervenor Compensation Program.

In addition, TURN worked with Communications Division to establish logistics and settings for potential participants for the Commission's twoday public participation hearings (PPH). This included a deliberate effort to facilitate the participation of individuals currently detained in California carceral facilities, without fear of retribution or retaliation. The time for this work is coded as ORG, COOR, PROC, and CD.

Discovery

As referenced in the "research" discussion above, the communications services for incarcerated persons are novel issues for the Commission. This means that not all the service providers for communications services for incarcerated persons were not very familiar with the Commission's discovery rules and process, prior this proceeding. Relatedly, at the federal level, the FCC proceeding had several rounds of rulemakings completed that included a protective order for material submitted to the FCC. TURN spent considerable resources and time to review the FCC rules and protective order and to attempt to negotiate separate nondisclosure agreements for purposes of the Commission's proceeding with the parties that are the four of the largest service providers of communications services for incarcerated persons in California. Several attempts were made to execute a nondisclosure agreement with these parties that were service providers for communication services for incarcerated persons in California. Only a subset of these efforts resulted in an executed nondisclosure agreement with a service provider for these services in California.

TURN advocates also spent resources to draft and deliver data requests to the majority of service providers for these services in California; only a subset of these providers responded. TURN reviewed the responses to data requests that TURN submitted and that Cal Advocates submitted to a subset of service providers. In addition, TURN reviewed other parties' efforts to seek responses to data requests from parties in the Commission's proceeding, and reviewed the Administrative Law Judges' response to these parties' efforts. *See* Administrative Law Judge and Assigned Commissioner's Ruling Compelling Production of Documents (Sep. 13, 2021). The time for this work is coded as "DR."

Intervenor Compensation-Related Time

TURN is requesting compensation for 15.75 hours devoted to compensation-related matters. Of these hours, 1.75 hours were devoted to the preparation of the Notice of Intent to Claim Intervenor Compensation; TURN submits that this is a reasonable amount of time given that this was Mrs. Villanueva's first time preparing an NOI.

Moreover, as the time record reflects, Ms. Salas prepared a portion of the compensation claim in 2022 given her availability and experience in claim preparation. Ultimately, TURN decided to wait to submit the claim until the Court of Appeals issued its opinion related to the writ of review of the underlying Commission decision adopting interim relief. Since the Court of Appeals issued its opinion and later published this opinion upholding the Commission's underlying decision in early 2023, Mrs. Villanueva completed the remaining portion of the compensation claim in 2023 because she has been the lead attorney for TURN in this proceeding.

Villanueva in 2020. The Commission has yet to act upon that intervenor compensation claim. Rather than repeat the same showing here for the requested hourly rate for Mrs. Villanueva, TURN refers the Commission to the showing presented in A.20-11-001.
	2022 Hourly Rate for Brenda D. Villanueva
	Mrs. Villanueva joined TURN as a Staff Attorney in October 2020, bringing with her six years of legal experience as a practicing attorney at the FCC, in addition to the telecom policy experience she gained through legal internships at the FCC, and during her nearly six years of working for the U.S. House of Representatives in Congressman Baca's office. In D.22-06-038, the

Commission agreed with TURN that Mrs. Villanueva should be considered a
Level III Attorney under the hourly rate framework adopted in Resolution ALJ-
393 and adopted an hourly rate of \$410 for her work at TURN in 2021. The
Commission explained, "The hourly rate of \$410 places Villanueva midway
between the range approved for attorneys with 5-7 years and is justified based on
Villanueva's 6 years of practice as an attorney. We approve the rate here. This
leaves TURN significant room to justify an increase to Villanueva's rate over
the next four years within this level, as Villanueva's expertise, tasks, and
organizational responsibilities increase." (D.22-06-038, pp. 59-60).

Pursuant to the Commission's invitation in D.22-06-038, TURN now seeks an increase to Mrs. Villanueva's hourly rate in 2022 beyond the COLA that otherwise would apply. At the end of 2021, Mrs. Villanueva assumed the responsibilities held for many years by TURN Managing Attorney Christine Mailloux, who departed TURN. As of 2022, Mrs. Villanueva oversees TURN's telecommunications advocacy before the CPUC, FCC, NTIA, California Legislature and U.S. Congress, including sector-wide policy development, legislative and legal strategy, and supervision of TURN's telecommunications advocacy team. In addition to her own casework, she coordinates case prioritization, external government outreach, assignments, and workload management for TURN's telecommunications attorneys, experts, and analysts. She also works with TURN's Race and Equity Team to provide impactful race impact analysis to all of TURN's telecommunications advocacy.

Given this significant expansion in Mrs. Villanueva's expertise, tasks, and organizational responsibilities, TURN submits that a rate of \$465 is appropriate for her work in 2022. The Commission's 2022 hourly rate range for a Level III Attorney is \$319.98 - \$536.62 (calculated as the 2021 range of \$309.76 - \$519.48 adjusted by the 3.3% COLA for 2022). The requested rate reasonably reflects Mrs. Villanueva's significantly expanded responsibilities at TURN in 2022.

TURN also requested a 2022 rate of \$465 for Mrs. Villanueva based on her expanded role at TURN in R.20-02-008. That claim, filed on July 22, 2022, shortly after the issuance of D.22-06-038, is currently pending.

To avoid any confusion, TURN notes that a proposed decision in R.20-08-021 on the Commission's agenda for April 6, 2023, would adopt a lower rate of \$425 for Mrs. Villanueva in 2022 based on a different rationale. The proposed decision in R.20-08-021 would arrive at a 2022 rate for Mrs. Villanueva by applying the 2022 annual escalation rate of 3.31% to her authorized 2021 rate of \$410. TURN did not request a 2022 rate in the R.20-08-021 claim based on Mrs. Villanueva's role change because TURN filed the claim on April 25, 2022, before the issuance of D.22-06-038. Irrespective of the outcome in R.20-08-021, TURN requests that the Commission authorize a rate of \$465 for Mrs.

	2023 Hourly Rate for Brenda D. Villanueva

Comment 2	2020 Hourly Rate for Jorge Rivera
	This is TURN's first request for compensation that includes work performed by Jorge Rivera, who joined TURN in October 2020 as the Southern California Organizer and shortly thereafter, assumed the role of TURN's Organizing and Advocacy Campaign Director – Southern California. The Commission has not previously adopted an hourly rate for Mr. Rivera. TURN is requesting a rate of \$125 for Mr. Rivera's work in 2020.
	In D.08-04-010, the Commission addressed the required showing for new intervenor representatives appearing before the Commission. The Commission instructed that the requested rate must be within the established range of rates for any given level of experience, and must take into consideration the rates previously awarded other representatives with comparable training and experience and who perform similar services. In Resolution ALJ-387, the Commission extended these requirements to requests for 2020 hourly rates for new representatives.
	Mr. Rivera arrived at TURN in 2020 with more than 13 years of experience providing direct social services and leading community organizing and advocacy
campaigns to advance justice in disadvantaged communities. This experience informed his efforts in this proceeding to expand the Commission's ability to receive input directly from incarcerated and detained calling services individuals, families, and related experts, thereby improving the administrative record in foundational ways. Mr. Rivera has been an executive director, a program director, a program manager, a program coordinator, a community organizer, a case manager, and a community service worker. From 1997-2003, he provided direct services to vulnerable communities as a Program Manager and Inclusion Facilitator at Aspira Foster Family Agency; a Program Director at Wings of Refuge Foster Family Agency; and a Case Manager for Early Childhood Services at Harbor Regional Center. From 2011-2012, he served as a Community Service Worker for the City of Long Beach, Development Services. From 2013 until joining TURN in 2020, Mr. Rivera developed and supported programs and campaigns to advance the policy goals of the organizations and communities he has served. He worked as a Community Organizer for Housing Long Beach: an Outreach Coordinator for Long Beach Community Action Partnership; a Founder and Program Director for Long Beach Residents Empowered (LiBRE); and the Southern California Regional Coordinator for Tenants Together. In early 2020, Mr. Rivera founded and began serving as the Executive Co-Director of The People's Resource Center / Healing Justice Center, where he oversees the Tenant Hotline and develops and helps to implement local, statewide, and national social justice campaigns to support community empowerment, family wellness, and healthy housing. He continued his work with The People's Resource Center throughout his time at TURN. Mr. Rivera has a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology/Philosophy from California State University, Long Beach. His resume is included in TURN Claim Attachment 4.

The requested hourly rate of \$125 is far below the bottom of the range for 2020 rates adopted by the Commission in Resolution ALJ 387 for experts with 13+ years of experience, which is \$190-\$465. The requested rate is also far below the bottom of the range for 2020 rates for experts with 0-6 years of experience, \$160-\$225.

Further, the requested rate is lower than hourly rates previously adopted by the Commission for community advocates and community organizers with similar experience to Mr. Rivera's. In D.22-04-019, the Commission adopted an hourly rate of \$185 for Refugio Valencia in 2018. Mr. Valencia had worked as a community advocate for more than fifteen years at that time and was currently serving as a Community Organizer for the Center on Race, Poverty & the Environment. (D.22-04-019, p. A4). In D.18-10-051, the Commission authorized a rate of \$175 for Strela Cervas in 2016 (and extended the 2016 rate to her work in 2017 and 2018 in that proceeding). Ms. Cervas had 18 years of community advocacy experience at that time and had been the California Environmental Justice Alliance's Statewide Organizer Director since 2017. (D.18-10-051, p. 26). While Mr. Rivera has 13+ years of community advocacy experience, compared to Mr. Valencia's 15+ years and Ms. Cervas's 18+ years,

the requested 2020 hourly rate for Mr. Rivera (\$125) is also significantly lower than the rate authorized for Valencia (\$185 in 2018) and Cervas (\$175 in 2016-2018).

For all of these reasons, TURN submits that \$125 is a very reasonable rate for Mr. Rivera in 2020.

2021 Hourly Rate for Jorge Rivera

In Resolution (Res.) ALJ-393, the Commission adopted a new methodology for setting Intervenor Compensation hourly rates, based on a Market Rate Study. The new methodology defines comparable hourly rates for seventy-nine intervenor "labor roles," at five levels of experience and education. For each level, a market rate-based hourly rate range is established. The Commission directed intervenors "to use the Hourly Rate Chart spreadsheet available on the Commission's ICOMP website (www.cpuc.ca.gov/icomp) to determine the appropriate hourly rate when completing claims for work performed on or after January 1, 2021." (Res. ALJ-393, pp. 3-4). The Commission clarified that hourly rates for 2021 will be based on the approved hourly rate ranges in the Market Rate Study, without regard to previously established hourly rates for 2020 or prior years. (Res. ALJ-393, p. 4). Finally, the Commission directed intervenors to submit, in their first claim seeking compensation for work completed in 2021 and beyond, the following information to establish hourly rates: (1) a current resume as a supporting document, and (2) a justification for the requested rate that ties to the individual's labor role and level of experience, per the Market Rate Study's Hourly Rate Chart. (Res. ALJ-393, p. 5).

Pursuant to the requirements of ALJ-393, TURN hereby submits its request for a 2021 hourly rate for Jorge Rivera, who served as TURN's Organizing and Advocacy Campaign Director – Southern California until April 2022.

Jorge Rivera joined TURN in October 2020 as the Southern California Organizer and shortly thereafter, assumed the role of TURN's Organizing and Advocacy Campaign Director – Southern California until April 2022, when he left TURN. Mr. Rivera coordinated TURN's organizing work in Southern California to support TURN's regulatory and legislative activities and provided counseling and training to members, community based organizations and allies. Mr. Rivera has a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology/Philosophy from California State University, Long Beach.

Mr. Rivera arrived at TURN with more than 13 years of experience providing direct social services and leading community organizing and advocacy campaigns to advance justice in disadvantaged communities. From 1997-2003, he provided direct services to vulnerable communities as a Program Manager and Inclusion Facilitator at Aspira Foster Family Agency; a Program Director at Wings of Refuge Foster Family Agency; and a Case Manager for Early Childhood Services at Harbor Regional Center. From 2011-2012, he served as a Community Service Worker for the City of Long Beach, Development Services. From 2013 until joining TURN in 2020, Mr. Rivera developed and supported programs and campaigns to advance the policy goals of the organizations and communities he has served. He worked as a Community Organizer for Housing Long Beach: an Outreach Coordinator for Long Beach Community Action Partnership; a Founder and Program Director for Long Beach Residents Empowered (LiBRE); and the Southern California Regional Coordinator for Tenants Together. In early 2020, Mr. Rivera founded and began serving as the Executive Co-Director of The People's Resource Center / Healing Justice Center, where he oversees the Tenant Hotline and develops and helps to implements local, statewide, and national social justice campaigns to support community empowerment, family wellness, and healthy housing. He continued his work with The People's Resource Center throughout his time at TURN. In TURN Claim Attachment 4, TURN provides two versions of Mr. Rivera's resume, including the version he provided to TURN in 2020 and his current resume including TURN, as the older version includes a more complete history of relevant employment before TURN.

The Market Rate Study Hourly Rate Chart instructs that an Advocate – Not Otherwise Classified is used for advocate roles that are not better classified as one of the more detailed roles, including for example consumer advocates, and may also be used for advocates that fill multiple sub-roles. The Hourly Rate Chart further requires a Level IV Advocate – Not Otherwise Classified to have a Bachelor's Degree and 10-15 years of experience.

Mr. Rivera satisfies all of these requirements. He has a Bachelor's Degree and, as of the beginning of 2021, more than 13 years of experience advocating for disadvantaged individuals and communities in many different advocacy capacities. He has been an executive director, a program director, a program manager, a program coordinator, a community organizer, a case manager, and a community service worker. For this reason, TURN submits that the Commission should consider Mr. Rivera a Level IV Advocate – Not Otherwise

	Classified for the purpose of setting an hourly rate for his work before the Commission on behalf of TURN.
	Given Mr. Rivera's experience, TURN submits that an hourly rate of \$125 is very reasonable for his work before the Commission in 2021. This rate is lower than the median rate of \$137.79 for a Level IV Advocate – Not Otherwise Classified.
Comment 3	2021 Hourly Rate for Constance Slider Pierre
	TURN requests a 2021 hourly rate of \$200 for TURN Organizing Director Constance Slider Pierre.
	TURN previously filed an intervenor compensation claim in A.21-11-017 on August 8, 2022, that included a request that the Commission adopt an hourly rate of \$205 for Ms. Slider Pierre in 2022 pursuant to Resolution ALJ-393. At that time, TURN had not requested an hourly rate for Ms. Slider Pierre's work in 2021. TURN accordingly presented the showing required by Resolution ALJ- 393 in seeking a 2022 hourly rate for Ms. Slider Pierre.

Thank you for the time in allowing us to gather responses from some of the stakeholders as it pertains to the planned PPH(s).

Based on the responses we would like following considerations to be taken into account:

 <u>Retaliation</u> – all groups have expressed very serious concerns around retaliation for those incarcerated/detained as well as for the family members/loved ones of those incarcerated/detained.

Therefore, we would like to stress the need for:

a. Anonymity

- i. Blocking Phone Numbers of those calling in to participate in the hearing
- ii. Ensuring participant lists are not made available to facilities and/or service providers
- iii. Video tech ensuring identifying information for participants on video are not made public or captured in some way that can be obtained by facility staff or providers
- iv. Not <u>requiring</u> participants to state their full name when sharing testimony; voluntarily shared would be preferred

billing or similar purposes with the Service Provider. The Service Providers shall provide this advance notification at least 30 days prior to the first public participation hearing and shall provide the advance notification throughout the 30-day period. For example, for website, webportal and/or online bills, the Service Providers shall prominently place the advance notice information on these channels 30 days prior to and continuously throughout the entire 30-day period. For e-mails, texts and/or recorded messages, the Service Providers shall initially send the advance notification information at least 30 days prior to the first public hearing and shall send the information an additional three times at regular intervals prior to the date of the first hearing. The Service Providers are free to use other means in addition to these four methods to provide advance notification of the public hearings.

The Service Providers shall include all information included in Attachment A in all written advance notifications (websites, webportals, e-mails, online bills). The Service Providers shall provide all information in Attachment B in all texts and recorded messages serving as notices of the public participation hearings. The Service Providers shall promptly prepare draft advance notifications for each of the four communication channels that they utilize and shall submit them to the CPUC's Public Advisor's Office for review at least 40 days prior to the first public hearing. The Public Advisor's Office may alter or require changes to the bill insert.

1. Correction to Attachment A of February 26, 2021 Ruling

It has come to my attention that there was an error in Attachment A of my February 26, 2021 *Ruling Setting Public Participation Hearings and Requirements to Provide Advance Notification* (February Ruling). Attachment A to the February Ruling states, "You can also submit comments by mail or post them on the CPUC's public comment portal at any time before May 1, 2021."

This ruling corrects this error by striking the May 1, 2021 date. The public may submit comments on the public comment portal for this rulemaking at any time. The five Commissioners, industry staff, and I will receive and will consider

comments provided on the public comment portal throughout the entire period this proceeding is open.

This sentence in Attachment A of the February Ruling is therefore corrected as follows: "You can also submit comments by mail or post them on the CPUC's public comment portal at any time the <u>proceeding is open</u> before May 1, 2021." - Not require callers to provide or record names or locations at any point during their call; and,
- Assign each caller a "port number," which will be read in lieu of the caller's name to signal his or her turn to speak.

3.2. Public Comment Portal

As of March 26, 2021, the public comment portal for Rulemaking

(R.) 20-10-002 will be modified to make following fields optional for individuals

wishing to leave a comment on the portal:

- Last name
- First name
- Email
- City
- Zip Code

In addition, Commission staff will update the disclaimer language on the

public comment portal for R.20-10-002 as follows:

• Please be aware that <u>you are not required to provide your</u> <u>name, email, telephone number, location, or zip code to</u> <u>comment.</u> If you do not want this information to be made public with your comment, or to be publicly accessible through a California Public Record Act Request, do not include it when you submit your comment. However, if you do choose to provide this information, your name, location, and zip code will appear with your comment and all the information would be provided in response to a Public Records Act request pursuant to Government Code Section 6250 et seq.

Individuals wishing to provide a written comment may use the portal to provide comments that are available publicly or to provide private comments that are made available only to Commission staff. Please visit **cpuc.ca.gov/R2010002Comments** to submit a comment about this rulemaking.

Commission staff will flag and remove any comment deemed offensive or inappropriate.

Pursuant to California Government Code Section 6254 (c), records may be withheld if disclosure would constitute an invasion of personal privacy. Additionally, the Commission may prevent disclosure of records when the public interest in withholding those records clearly outweighs the public interest in disclosure. Moreover, the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act, Gov. Code Section 11124, states that "[n]o person shall be required, as a condition to attendance at a meeting of a state body, to register his or her name, to provide other information, to complete a questionnaire, or otherwise to fulfill any condition precedent to his or her attendance."

Disclosing the phone numbers of participants in the April 28, 2021 and April 29, 2021 public participation hearings would constitute an invasion of privacy. The public interest in withholding the phone numbers of hearing participants outweighs the public interest in disclosure of these phone numbers.

Therefore, in addition to the above procedures for the April public hearing and the R.20-10-002 public comment portal, the Commission will treat the phone numbers of callers to the April 28, 2021 and April 29, 2021 public participation hearings as confidential due to privacy concerns if this information is later sought in a Public Records Act request. Attachment A to the February Ruling is modified to reflect the Commission's modifications summarized herein along with several other minor corrections.
