**LIBERTY UTILITIES (CALPECO ELECTRIC) LLC’S (U 933-E)
ANNUAL PHYSICAL SECURITY REPORT**

Pursuant to Ordering Paragraph 31 of Decision (“D.”) 19-01-018, Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC (U 933 E) (“Liberty”) submits this Annual Physical Security Report to the Directors of the Safety and Enforcement and Energy Divisions of the California Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”). D.19-01-018 requires utilities to submit an annual report detailing physical incidents from the preceding year resulting in utility insurance claims, all OE-417 reports submitted during the period, and any significant changes to Security Plan Reports. The reporting period for this Annual Physical Security Report is April 1, 2023, through March 31, 2024.

Liberty did not experience physical attacks resulting in damage to its generation or power delivery assets from April 1, 2023, through March 31, 2024. No insurance claims were filed for the period, and no OE-417 reports were submitted to the U.S. Department of Energy.

Changes were made to adjust the schedule and associated costs in Liberty’s Physical Security
