ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE RIZZO: We are on the record. The Commission will come to order.

Today is Thursday, February 29, 2023 (sic). We are conducting this prehearing conference telephonically. Please mute your phones. This is the time and place for prehearing conference in the matter of Rulemaking 23-12-008, the Order Instituting Rulemaking Regarding Transportation Electrification Policy and Infrastructure.

My name is Colin Rizzo. I am the assigned administrative law judge to this proceeding. At today's hearing I am joined by Administrative Law Judge Marcelo Poirier who is also assigned with me on this proceeding. We are also joined by President Alice Reynolds who is the assigned commissioner to this proceeding.

For today's agenda, which is strictly procedural in nature, we will cover the following:

First --

(Audio interruption.)

ALJ RIZZO: -- we'll take appearances.

(Audio interruption.)

ALJ RIZZO: Second, we will address party

1 status; third, we will go over preliminary scoping
2 topics; and, four, we will discuss a preliminary
3 schedule.

4 Judge Poirier.

5 ALJ POIRIER: Thank you, Judge Rizzo.

6 Parties, I'm going to go over the ground rules
7 right now. We have a large number of parties on today's
8 call so it's essential that folks follow these ground
9 rules so that we have a clean transcript and everybody
10 is able to participate effectively.

11 Number one, speak only when addressed to by the
12 administrative law judges. Speak slowly --

13 (Audio interruption.)

14 ALJ POIRIER: -- and clearly. Identify the
15 person speaking every time that person speaks. Do not
16 interrupt or speak over one another. And, lastly, mute
17 line when not talking.

18 I think we're having a lot of background noise
19 already so please, please check to see that you are
20 muted and only unmute when you are directed to speak.

21 Please note that, number one, the reporter --

22 (Audio interruption.)

23 ALJ POIRIER: -- when possible to do so without
24 disrupting the proceeding when there is or are inaudible
25 statements or portions thereof; and, two, the reporter

1 will be inserting the word "inaudible" in the transcript
2 when there is a dropped, garbled, or otherwise
3 indecipherable audio.

4 Again --

5 (Audio interruption.)

6 ALJ POIRIER: -- if folks could mute your
7 lines, and we will -- I will (audio interruption) throw
8 it back to ALJ Rizzo to handle appearances.

9 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. I'm going to repeat
10 that one more time because I hear a lot of static and
11 noise in the background. Whoever has not muted their
12 phone, mute your phone now. You are disrupting the
13 hearing.

14 Next I'm going to address the appearances. I'm
15 going to take appearances from the parties in the order
16 in which I received notice of their participation to the
17 service list of this ruling following my notice setting
18 prehearing conference on February 8, 2024.

19 After I go through my list, if I did not call
20 your name, those parties will have the opportunity to
21 state their name and the entity they are representing --

22 THE REPORTER: Excuse me, Judge Rizzo. This is
23 the court reporter. I'm hearing a lot of typing on
24 keyboards and I'm not sure what. It's very disruptive.
25 So if I could please have you start again with "After I

1 go through my list." Excuse the interruption. Thank
2 you.

3 ALJ RIZZO: No, I do understand. I've said it
4 about five times. Someone is typing right now. We're
5 off the record.

6 (Off the record.)

7 ALJ RIZZO: We are back on the record.

8 I will now take appearances from the parties.
9 I will go in the order in which I received notice of
10 participation to the service list of this ruling
11 following my February 8, 2024, ruling.

12 After I go through my list, if I did not call
13 your name, you may state your name and the entity you
14 are representing. One last time, speak slowly and
15 clearly for the court reporter. State your first and
16 last name, and the party you are representing. When I
17 call your name, you may simply say "present."

18 First I have Amanda Myers Wisser for Weave
19 Grid, Inc. Are you present?

20 MS. MYERS WISSER: Present.

21 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next I have Anna Bella
22 from Fermata Energy. Are you present?

23 MS. BELLA: Present.

24 ALJ RIZZO: Next I have Benjamin Ellis from
25 Pacific Gas & Electric Company.

1 MR. ELLIS: Present.

2 ALJ RIZZO: Next I have Beth Kelly from the
3 Association of Bay Area Governments for the Bay Area
4 Regional Energy Network and County of Ventura for the
5 Tri-County Regional Energy Network. Are you present?

6 MS. KELLY: Present.

7 ALJ RIZZO: Next I have Collin Smith from
8 Leapfrog Power Inc. Are you present?

9 MR. SMITH: Present.

10 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next I have Francesca
11 Wahl from Tesla, Inc. Are you present?

12 MR. WAHL: Present.

13 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next I have Howard
14 Golub from the City of Long Beach, California, a
15 Municipal Corporation, Acting By and Through its Board
16 of Harbor Commissioners. Are you present?

17 MR. GOLUB: Yes, I'm present.

18 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next I have Isabelle
19 Montoya from The Utility Reform Network. Are you
20 present?

21 MS. MONTOYA: Present.

22 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next I have Jane
23 Krikorian from the Utility Consumers Action Network.
24 Are you present?

25 MS. KRIKORIAN: Present.

1 ALJ RIZZO: Next I have Jeb Gibson from Bear
2 Valley Electric Service. Are you present?

3 MR. GIBSON: Present.

4 ALJ RIZZO: Next I have Jonathan Kendrick from
5 the California Large Energy Consumers Association. Are
6 you present?

7 MR. KENDRICK: Present.

8 ALJ RIZZO: Next I have Melissa Kasnitz from
9 the Center for Accessible Technology. Are you present?

10 MS. KASNITZ: Present.

11 ALJ RIZZO: Next I have Michael Einhorn from
12 the Public Advocates Office. Are you present?

13 MR. EINHORN: I'm present, your Honor.

14 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next I have Nikhil --
15 I'm -- excuse me for not pronouncing this correctly --
16 but Vijaykar from Ava Community Energy/City of San Jose,
17 Clean Power Alliance of Southern California, Marin Clean
18 Energy, Peninsula Clean Energy Authority, San Diego
19 Community Power, and Sonoma Clean Power Authority. I'm
20 going to give you the opportunity to state your name
21 clearly for the record. I apologize for mispronouncing
22 it.

23 MR. VIJAYKAR: No problem, your Honor. Good
24 afternoon. This is Nikhil Vijaykar on behalf of those
25 parties. Thank you.

1 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next I have Rachael
2 Koss from the Coalition of California Utility Employees.
3 Are you present?

4 MS. KOSS: Present.

5 ALJ RIZZO: Next I have Rebecca
6 Meiers-DePastino from Southern California Edison
7 Company. Are you present?

8 MS. MEIERS-DEPASTINO: Present.

9 ALJ RIZZO: Next I have Sahm White for Claire
10 Bloom for 350 Bay Area. Are you present?

11 MR. WHITE: Sahm White, present. Yes, thank
12 you.

13 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next I have Samuel Goda
14 from Kaluza. Are you present?

15 (No response.)

16 ALJ RIZZO: I'll repeat that. Next I have
17 Samuel Goda from Kaluza. Are you present?

18 (No response.)

19 ALJ RIZZO: The record notes he's not present
20 at today's prehearing conference.

21 Next I have Seth Hilton from Air Products and
22 Chemicals Inc. Are you present?

23 MR. HILTON: Present.

24 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next I have Steve
25 Campbell from Vote Solar. Are you present?

1 MR. CAMPBELL: Present.

2 ALJ RIZZO: Next I have Tam Hunt from the Green
3 Power Institute. Are you present?

4 MR. HUNT: Present.

5 ALJ RIZZO: Next I have Thomas Brill from Pilot
6 Travel Centers LLC. Are you present?

7 MR. BRILL: Present.

8 ALJ RIZZO: Finally, I have Walter Waidelich
9 from San Diego Gas & Electric Company. Are you present?

10 MR. WAIDELICH: Present.

11 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Now, for those who are
12 on the call whose names I did not list but who would
13 like to state their name and their party, you may do so
14 now by going one at a time very slowly because we are on
15 a conference line.

16 Just a reminder, state your name by stating
17 your first and last name slowly for our court reporter
18 and the entity you are presenting. So for those who I
19 did not call, take yourselves off mute and follow the
20 instructions.

21 MS. WEBERSKI: Good afternoon. This is
22 Jennifer Weberski, W-e-b-e-r-s-k-i, for Small Business
23 Utility Advocates.

24 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

25 (Crosstalk.)

1 ALJ RIZZO: Wait. I'm sorry. People are
2 talking over each other.

3 Jennifer Weberski, did you have something you
4 wanted to add?

5 MS. WEBERSKI: No, that was it.

6 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. All right. We had two
7 people speaking at once. Let's just have one go at a
8 time. Again, I appreciate your patience with the
9 telephonic prehearing conference.

10 (Crosstalk.)

11 MR. HAFEZ: Your Honor, this is Samir Hafez,
12 S-a-m-i-r, last name H-a-f-e-z representing Clean
13 Energy.

14 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: This is Minh --

16 MR. HERNANDEZ: Your Honor, Paul Hernandez
17 representing Voltera Power LLC. Paul Hernandez, P-a-u-l
18 H-e-r-n-a-n-d-e-z, representing Voltera, V-o-l-t-e-r-a.

19 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: This is --

21 (Crosstalk.)

22 ALJ RIZZO: One at a time.

23 MS. RYAN: This is Nancy Ryan, R-y-a-n,
24 representing Alliance for Automotive Innovation.

25 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

1 MR. LE: This is Minh Le, M-i-n-h L-e
2 representing the County of Los Angeles.

3 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

4 MS. YOUNGBLOOD: This is Candice Youngblood
5 representing East Yard Communities for Environmental
6 Justice.

7 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

8 MR. HALSO: This is Joe Halso, H-a-l-s-o,
9 representing the Sierra Club.

10 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

11 (Crosstalk.)

12 ALJ RIZZO: Let's start over. Please continue.
13 One of you -- I heard crosstalk, so just one of you go
14 for it.

15 MR. BELSER: This is Evan Belser, B-e-l-s-e-r,
16 Ford Motor Company.

17 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

18 (Crosstalk.)

19 ALJ RIZZO: Okay. There's crosstalk. One at
20 a --

21 MR. JERMYN: This is Cole Jermyn. This is Cole
22 Jermyn, J-e-r-m-y-n, representing Environmental Defense
23 Fund.

24 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

25 MR. WOOGEN: This is Zach Woogen representing

1 the Vehicle Grid Integration Council. Zach's spelled
2 Z-a-c-h, Woogen, W-o-o-g-e-n. Thank you.

3 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

4 MR. GARCIA: This is Noah Garcia, N-o-a-h
5 G-a-r-c-i-a representing EVgo Services LLC.

6 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

7 MR. CHATTERJEE: This is Kinshuk Chatterjee.
8 That's spelled K-i-n-s-h-u-k C-h-a-t-t-e-r-j-e-e. I'm
9 representing the Center for Sustainable Energy. Thank
10 you.

11 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

12 MS. HAMMON: This is Beth, B-e-t-h, Hammon,
13 H-a-m-m-o-n, with Natural Resources Defense Council.

14 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

15 MS. CHOU: This is Wendy, W-e-n-d-y, Chou,
16 C-h-o-u, representing Acterra, A-c-t-e-r-r-a. Thank
17 you.

18 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

19 MR. BONELLI: This is David Bonelli
20 representing Powering America's Commercial
21 Transportation. Thank you, your Honor.

22 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

23 MR. MACCURDY: This is Dwight MacCurdy,
24 M-a-c-C-u-r-d-y, representing the Electric Vehicle
25 Association, Sacramento branch.

1 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

2 MS. HOUSTON: Hello. This is Sam Houston,
3 H-o-u-s-t-o-n, representing the Union of Concerned
4 Scientists.

5 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next. That would be
6 the last caller. Is there anyone else on the line who
7 would like to state their name and the party they're
8 representing?

9 MS. WARHEIT: I would be happy to do that. I'm
10 confused if you want people who were for information
11 purposes only or if this is for the purposes of seeking
12 party status.

13 ALJ RIZZO: We will be moving to party status
14 in a moment. This is for the Commission to understand
15 who is on the call. So you may make your motion for
16 party status, and if you want to be "Information Only,"
17 you may do that in the next phase of the proceeding.
18 But for now, please do state your name and the entity
19 that you're choosing to represent.

20 MS. WARHEIT: Great. Thank you very much, your
21 Honor. My name is Vanessa, V-a-n-e-s-s-a, last name
22 Warheit, W-a-r-h-e-i-t, representing Acterra.

23 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Is there anybody
24 else --

25 (Crosstalk.)

1 (Reporter clarification.)

2 MR. XIE: Sorry. Let's try that one more time.
3 My name is Yihao, Y-i-h-a-o, Xie, X-i-e, and I represent
4 the International Council on Clean Transportation, ICCT.

5 MS. PARRA: Good afternoon. My name is
6 Margarita Parra, M-a-r-g-a-r-i-t-a, last name P-a-r-r-a,
7 representing Clean Energy Works. Thank you.

8 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you, both.

9 Is there anyone else on the line who has not
10 had an opportunity to state their name and their
11 organization?

12 (Crosstalk.)

13 MR. BOYCE: Bill Boyce, last name B-o-y-c-e,
14 representing the West Coast Clean Transit Corridor.

15 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

16 (Crosstalk.)

17 MR. TURNER: Brian Turner, B-r-i-a-n
18 T-u-r-n-e-r, Advanced Energy United.

19 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

20 MR. MACCURDY: Your Honor, this is Dwight
21 MacCurdy speaking on behalf of Guy Hall for the Electric
22 Vehicle Association. He's on the line but somehow is
23 not able to get his voice through.

24 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you for that. Anybody else?

25 MR. BRINT: Good afternoon, your Honor. This

1 is Ben Brint, B-e-n B-r-i-n-t representing Switch
2 Energy Inc.

3 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Next.

4 (No response.)

5 ALJ RIZZO: Okay. Now that we have addressed
6 everyone who is present at this prehearing conference,
7 Judge Poirier will now move for motions to party status.

8 ALJ POIRIER: Thank you, Judge Rizzo.

9 First off, I want to address the motions for
10 party status that were filed formally. I have several
11 of those. I'm going to run through each of those. We
12 have Vote Solar, motion for party status. Finding good
13 cause, that motion is granted.

14 (Vote Solar was granted Party Status.)

15 ALJ POIRIER: We have International Council on
16 Clean Transportation. Again finding good cause, that
17 motion is granted.

18 (International Council on Clean
19 Transportation was granted Party Status.)

20 ALJ POIRIER: We have the Electric Vehicle
21 Association. Finding good cause, that motion for party
22 status is granted.

23 (Electric Vehicle Association was granted
24 Party Status.)

25 ALJ POIRIER: We have Switch Energy. Finding

1 good cause, that motion for party status is granted.

2 (Switch Energy was granted Party Status.)

3 ALJ POIRIER: We have East Yard Communities for
4 Environmental Justice. Again, we find that good cause
5 and grant that motion for party status.

6 (East Yard Communities for Environmental
7 Justice was granted Party Status.)

8 ALJ POIRIER: Next is Local Government
9 Sustainable Energy Coalition. We grant that motion for
10 party status.

11 (Local Government Sustainable Energy
12 Coalition was granted Party Status.)

13 ALJ POIRIER: Next is Sierra Club. Finding
14 good cause, we grant that motion for party status.

15 (Sierra Club was granted Party Status.)

16 ALJ POIRIER: And lastly, we have the Western
17 Riverside Council of Governments. Finding good cause,
18 we grant that motion for party status.

19 (Western Riverside Council of Governments
20 was granted Party Status.)

21 ALJ POIRIER: Now I'm going to entertain oral
22 motions for party status. I'm going to call out in a
23 second, but I want to prime you for the questions that
24 we're going to be asking.

25 First off, we're going to ask you to state your

1 name and spell it and who you represent, indicate that
2 you want to make a motion for party status. Next you're
3 going to have to discuss your interest in this
4 proceeding and how you intend to participate. Then I
5 will open it up to see if anybody objects to the motion.

6 So with that, does anyone seek to make an oral
7 motion for party status?

8 MR. BRILL: Your Honor, this is Thomas --
9 (Audio interruption.)

10 MR. BRILL: -- Brill from the Pilot Travel
11 Centers. We filed a written motion, but it was not
12 mentioned. So if you would like me to do this orally,
13 I'd be glad to.

14 ALJ POIRIER: Let's back up a second. Can you
15 state your name. This is Pilot and --

16 (Crosstalk.)

17 MR. BRILL: Yes. It's Thomas -- it's Thomas
18 Brill, B-r-i-l-l. I represent Pilot Travel Centers. We
19 filed a written motion for party status, but I'd be glad
20 to do it orally if that would help.

21 ALJ POIRIER: I checked the service list, and I
22 think you are on there as a party. So I think in
23 response to some of your filings, you were granted it
24 previously. So I will confirm off-line, but to repeat
25 that, you are granted that motion for party status, but

1 I will confirm. As of my last check, you were on the
2 service list as a party.

3 MR. BRILL: Thanks, your Honor.

4 ALJ POIRIER: Next.

5 MS. CHOU: Your Honor, this is Wendy Chou,
6 C-h-o-u, representing Acterra, A-c-t-e-r-r-a. I would
7 like to make a motion to request party status.

8 ALJ POIRIER: Okay. Can you please state your
9 interest in this proceeding and how you intend to
10 participate.

11 MS. CHOU: I intend to participate by listening
12 and offering perspective based on my familiarity with
13 the EV Charging For All Coalition that Acterra hosts.
14 And -- sorry. The second part of the question? Oh, my
15 interest?

16 Acterra is a community-based organization, and
17 we particularly are interested in providing education
18 for consumers who are of communities that are
19 historically underserved and stand to gain the most by
20 switching to electric transportation.

21 ALJ POIRIER: And the follow-up question to
22 that: Are you intending to file comments or participate
23 actively in the proceeding or are you just intending to
24 monitor?

25 MS. CHOU: I'm actively going to be

1 participating and providing comments.

2 ALJ POIRIER: Okay. Thank you.

3 Does anybody object to the motion of Acterra
4 for party status?

5 (No response.)

6 ALJ POIRIER: Hearing none, I grant the motion
7 for party status of Acterra.

8 (Acterra was granted Party Status.)

9 MS. CHOU: Thank you, your Honor.

10 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you.

11 MR. HUNT: Good afternoon, your Honor. Tam
12 Hunt with the Green Power Institute. We're currently
13 listed as "Information Only." I wanted to ask: Do we
14 need to still submit a motion for party status today?

15 ALJ POIRIER: Why don't you make an oral
16 statement. Let's go ahead and do that just for -- to
17 make it --

18 (Crosstalk.)

19 ALJ POIRIER: Please go ahead.

20 MR. HUNT: So Tam Hunt, Green Power Institute.

21 We are a nonprofit advocate for green power and
22 related EV policies and have been doing so for some time
23 in California -- almost two decades now. We intend to
24 be active participants. We have been active since 2008
25 on the EVHs at the Commission. We intend to continue to

1 advocate for wise EV policy.

2 ALJ POIRIER: Thank you. Does any party object
3 to the motion of Green Power Institute for party status?

4 (No response.)

5 ALJ POIRIER: Hearing none, I grant the request
6 for party status for Green Power Institute. Thank you.

7 (Green Power Institute was granted Party
8 Status.)

9 ALJ POIRIER: Anybody else on the line that's
10 seeking party status?

11 MS. HOUSTON: Yes. My name is Sam Houston,
12 S-a-m H-o-u-s-t-o-n, and I represent the Union of
13 Concerned Scientists, and I would like to make a motion
14 for party status.

15 ALJ POIRIER: Thank you. Could you state your
16 interest in the proceeding and how you intend to
17 participate.

18 MS. HOUSTON: Yes, your Honor. UCS is a
19 nonprofit organization with over half a million members
20 and supporters nationwide, including over 85,000 in
21 California. Those members are residential customers in
22 utility service territories across the state and have a
23 substantial interest in this proceeding. UCS as an
24 organization conducts scientific and technical analysis
25 and research in the public interest, and we intend to

1 bring that research and analysis to this proceeding.

2 We've participated in a number of Commission
3 proceedings over the past few decades, including the
4 most recent OIR, the precursor to this docket in which
5 we participated significantly. We intend to continue
6 that significant participation in this proceeding by
7 filing comments as well as participating in additional
8 opportunities such as workshops and the like if they
9 come up with a particular focus on the continued
10 development of the transportation electrification
11 framework, the advancement of vehicle grid integration,
12 as well as proactive grid investment to accommodate
13 electric vehicle charging.

14 ALJ POIRIER: Okay. Thank you.

15 Do we have any objections to this motion?

16 (No response.)

17 ALJ POIRIER: Hearing none, we grant the motion
18 for party status for Union of Concerned Scientists.

19 Thank you.

20 (Union of Concerned Scientists was granted
21 Party Status.)

22 ALJ POIRIER: Would anybody else like to move
23 for party status?

24 (No response.)

25 ALJ POIRIER: Okay. So last call. With that,

1 we're going to move on. If anyone wants to be added to
2 the service list in the "Information Only" category, you
3 may do so by sending an email to our process office.
4 Anyone in the future who wants to be added as a party
5 will need to submit a motion in accordance with Rule 1.4
6 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.

7 With that, we'll return to ALJ Rizzo.

8 ALJ RIZZO: Thank you. Now I will move on to
9 the preliminary issues for consideration. Previously we
10 sent a ruling to the service list on February 8, 2024,
11 that set forth some preliminary issues that may be
12 covered in this proceeding. The preliminary issues
13 covered an array of topics contained within the
14 parameters of the OIR that included identifying the
15 time, location, and size of electric vehicle charging
16 load to support proactive grid planning and future
17 generation distribution and transmission infrastructure
18 deployment needs.

19 For parties who wish to read the entirety of
20 this ruling, I direct you to the Commission's docket
21 card for this proceeding which is available on the
22 Commission's website.

23 The preliminary list contained within this
24 ruling is not exhaustive and may change. To facilitate
25 an efficient telephonic prehearing conference, I

1 provided all the parties with this proposed scope when
2 the ruling setting forth the prehearing conference was
3 issued on February 8, 2024.

4 Since every party was given notice of what the
5 preliminary scope may contain, both within this ruling
6 and within the Commission's Order Instituting
7 Rulemaking, and given an opportunity to comment both on
8 the ruling and the OIR, it is not necessary to have each
9 party respond to the scope at this time.]

10 The Commission received the comments on both
11 the OIR and the preliminary scope to this proceeding.
12 The final scoping memo in this proceeding will be set
13 forth according to the commissioner's -- the assigned
14 commissioner's scoping memo and ruling.

15 So in the interest of time, I now turn to
16 Judge Poirier for the preliminary scheduling for the
17 initial phases of this proceeding.

18 ALJ POIRIER: Thank you, Judge Rizzo. I'm
19 going to touch on scheduling and what the future plan is
20 for this rulemaking. We did have lots of questions
21 about how that would happen. We are going to move
22 forward in this proceeding on a track basis. And what I
23 mean by that is we have different tracks to address
24 different subject areas within the rulemaking. Those
25 tracks will be running concurrently, but we are aware

1 that not everybody has an extreme amount of bandwidth so
2 we will be considerate of scheduling all those
3 activities in a reasonable manner.

4 We're not going to issue any schedule today.
5 We are going to issue the scoping memo. And then
6 subsequent to that, we will be issuing several different
7 rulings. Those rulings will address each track and lay
8 out the subject matter, any potential staff proposals,
9 or areas of comment for the parties.

10 So, again, today we don't have any hard and
11 fast rules -- or hard and fast schedules for those areas
12 but we will provide -- we'll provide more detail with
13 those rulings.

14 Again, those -- the issues are going to be --
15 the larger issues are going to be laid out in the scoping
16 memo, but we will lay out those comments -- or lay out
17 the schedule for each track in subsequent rulings.

18 So, again -- and it is possible that the
19 categorization will be different for a specific track of
20 the proceeding. We will address that in the scoping
21 memo or the rulings at a subsequent date.

22 So in terms of evidentiary hearings as well,
23 that's not something we can determine now. We have
24 largely had this proceeding run without evidentiary
25 hearings. But it may be necessary in each specific

1 area. We, again, will determine that at a later date.

2 With that, that concludes my comments on
3 schedule and the path moving forward. I do want to
4 provide an opportunity if parties need to raise any
5 issue. Not issues within the scope but issues for us to
6 deal procedurally with today at this time. Please be
7 mindful that we have a lot of folks on line. So if
8 anyone has any other matter to raise, please do so now.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Your Honor, I do have a
10 question.

11 ALJ POIRIER: Please state your name and who
12 you represent.

13 MR. MACCURDY: Yes, I'm sorry. This is Dwight
14 MacCurdy with the Electric Vehicle Association. And
15 given that we were just granted party status, would it
16 now be appropriate to submit our comments?

17 ALJ POIRIER: The comments as to?

18 MR. MACCURDY: The opening comments on the
19 proceeding.

20 ALJ POIRIER: Well, the date -- the date for
21 the comments was at the time was established earlier.
22 So we're not going to be allowing a separate tracking.
23 The time for those comments on the rulemaking and this
24 prehearing conference were laid out in previous rulings.

25 MR. MACCURDY: Okay. Thank you, your Honor.

1 ALJ POIRIER: That was the opportunity. We're
2 going to -- and on that note, folks, we have so many
3 parties here. In terms of manage proceeding (sic), it's
4 really important for folks to -- to take a close look at
5 the docket card to make sure that they're up to speed
6 and to closely follow those dates and deadlines since we
7 are anticipating a lot of participation, and we want to
8 hear from everybody. But we need to do so within the
9 parameters set by our rulings.

10 MR. MACCUDY: Yes. The reason I had brought
11 it up is we applied for party status well over a month
12 ago, but we didn't hear back. And so we weren't sure if
13 it would be appropriate to resubmit our comments that we
14 had previously submitted.

15 ALJ POIRIER: Why don't we take this off line
16 since --

17 MR. MACCUDY: Sure.

18 ALJ POIRIER: -- this is a procedural
19 conversation. And follow up at a later point.

20 MR. MACCUDY: Sure. Thank you.

21 ALJ POIRIER: Are there any other matters that
22 need to be raised?

23 (No response.)

24 ALJ POIRIER: Judge Rizzo, do you have anything
25 further that you want to discuss?

1 ALJ RIZZO: No. I do not, Judge Poirier.
2 Thank you.

3 I just do want to emphasize what Judge Poirier
4 said about checking the docket card regularly. We do
5 ask parties to mind the docket card so that you are
6 current on proceeding activity, so check it weekly.
7 Because this proceeding will move forward, and we expect
8 full participation from all those who do want to
9 participate in a timely manner the way the rulings lay
10 out. Thank you, Judge Poirier.

11 ALJ POIRIER: Thank you, Judge Rizzo.

12 With that, that concludes the matters that I
13 would like -- or we would like to cover today. I remind
14 parties that a scoping memo will be set forth, the
15 commissioner's scoping memo. And that will lay out more
16 details as to the scope of issues and higher level
17 issues. And relatively soon after that, we expect to
18 start issuing rulings that establish each of the tracks
19 coming forward.

20 So with that, this PHC in R.23-12-008 is
21 concluded, and we will be off the record.

22 (At the hour of 2:36 p.m., this matter having
23 been concluded, the Commission then
24 adjourned.)
