**ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGES' RULING
DENYING MOTION FOR PARTY STATUS**

On December 11, 2024, CALSTART, Inc. (CALSTART) filed a motion to become party in this proceeding pursuant to Rule 1.4 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. CALSTART is a nonprofit organization dedicated to the advancement of zero emission vehicle and infrastructure technology. As an organization that collaborates closely with clean transportation industry stakeholders, CALSTART states Southern California Edison Company's proposed Transportation Electrification Grid Readiness plan is of substantial interest to its organization and members. If its motion is granted, CALSTART intends to submit comments on the proposed decision based on the existing evidence presented by other parties.

As recognized by CALSTART, its motion comes late in this proceeding, having already passed the deadlines for serving testimony, conducting evidentiary hearing, and filing briefs. CALSTART fails to demonstrate that there is good cause for granting its motion at this late stage of the proceeding. Further,

allowing CALSTART's participation at this juncture would be unfair to parties who have actively contributed to the proceeding record.

Therefore, **IT IS RULED** that:

The Motion for Party Status of CALSTART, Inc. filed on December 11, 2024, is denied.
