To the A.25-07-017 Service List:

On September 16, 2025, Assistant Chief Administrative Law Judge Ava Tran issued a ruling directing Green Power Institute (GPI) to file additional information regarding its intervenor compensation claim in this proceeding (ACALJ Ruling).

On October 29, 2025, GPI filed a motion pursuant to Rules 11.1 and 11.4 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure requesting leave to file certain confidential information under seal. Specifically, GPI's motion seeks to file under seal Attachments A, B, and C of its October 29, 2025 response to Section 2.17 of the ACALJ Ruling. GPI asserts the entirety of Attachments A, B, and C consist of sensitive, confidential financial information, including agreements and invoices, and merit confidential treatment.

I find the attachments specified by GPI contain sensitive financial information and should be considered confidential. Good cause being shown, GPI's motion to file under seal is granted. Attachments A, B, and C of GPI's response to Section 2.17 of the ACALJ Ruling shall remain under seal shall not be accessible or disclosed to persons other than Commission staff except on further order or ruling of the Commission, the Administrative Law Judge to whom this proceeding is assigned, or the Administrative Law Judge then designated as the law and motion judge.
