NOTICE OF EX PARTE COMMUNICATION OF INVENERGY LLC

Pursuant to Rule 8.4(a) of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the California Public Utilities Commission ("Commission"), the Invenergy LLC ("Invenergy") provides this notice of one ex parte meeting.

The ex parte meeting was with Kourtney Vaccaro, Chief of Staff to Commissioner Karen Douglas. The meeting was held Wednesday, November 24, 2025 from 10:30 – 11:00am via WebEx. The following non-Commission persons were in attendance:

During the meeting, Invenergy explained its comments and opinions on the recent *Administrative Law Judge's Ruling Seeking Comments on Electricity Portfolios for 2026-2027 Transmission Planning Process and Need for Additional Reliability Procurement*, issued on September 30, 2025. Specifically, Invenergy emphasized the importance of preserving 4.5 GW of offshore wind deliverability to maintain consistent portfolios. To help manage costs, Invenergy also recommended exploring a shared interconnection approach for the Central Coast, modeled after the North Coast. In addition, Invenergy raised the timeframe and cost impacts of bringing both North Coast and Central Coast offshore wind online, noting the potential impacts of a Diablo Canyon extension and increasing load due to data centers. Invenergy also noted its new geothermal leases.

All communications were oral, and no written materials were shared.
