# San Diego Gas & Electric Company

## 2025 Cool Zone Report



### Program Overview

Since 2001, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E), in partnership with the County of San Diego and its Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA), has had the distinct privilege of offering the Cool Zone Program to the San Diego area. The Cool Zone Program is intended to provide support for individuals with access and functional needs (AFN) who could be impacted by the effects of high heat. Cool Zone facilities provide an air-conditioned space for individuals to escape the heat, with the added benefit of saving on their utility bills by running their home air conditioning less or not at all. This also helps to conserve energy during extreme, hot weather conditions. High heat events outside of the Cool Zone season are also supported by the County. The County coordinates directly with each Cool Zone facility to provide whatever is needed for the shoulder season.

This year, the Cool Zone Program launched on June 1, 2025, and concluded on October 31, 2025. A total of 88 Cool Zone sites in San Diego County<sup>1</sup> were opened to the public, which included libraries, community centers, and senior centers. An interactive map with the site location(s), phone number(s), operating hours, and the pet policy was made available to customers on the County's website, [coolzones.org](https://coolzones.org) (see Appendix B) and linked from SDG&E's website, [sdge.com/coolzones](https://sdge.com/coolzones).

In support of the Cool Zone Program, HHSA provided call support to answer customer calls, field questions, and refer customers to the nearest Cool Zone location, as requested by customers. HHSA provided SDG&E with a monthly activity report. The report includes outreach activities, number of site communications, and calls received (see Appendix A). Additionally, individuals in San Diego County who were unable to visit a Cool Zone location without transportation assistance had the option to be connected to an accessible transportation service, at no cost. Attendance counts are not a feasible metric for Cool Zone sites, as these locations are

public spaces such as libraries and community centers. These facilities operate as open, drop-in environments without registration requirements.

In addition to providing a safe place for customers to cool down during the high heat season, “Cool Zone Welcome Packets” containing information on customer assistance programs were assembled by SDG&E and provided to each of the sites for customer awareness. The Welcome Packets included information about SDG&E’s California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE), Family Electric Rate Assistance (FERA), and the Medical Baseline (MBL) Programs. Additionally, an informational brochure “Stay Cool and Safe this Summer,” which included other energy-saving tips, and information on the California Emerging Technology Fund (CETF), was provided.

Each tool kit contained the following materials:

- A welcome letter summarizing the Cool Zone program and dates of the program;
- A Cool Zone decal to be placed in the windows of each site;
- 10 copies of the Cool Zone brochure “Stay Cool and Safe this Summer,” which includes energy-saving tips (see Appendix D);
- 10 CARE applications (see Appendix C); and
- 10 MBL applications (see Appendix E).

Contact information for an SDG&E representative was provided to staff at each Cool Zone location to direct any questions or request additional collateral materials. A complete list of 2025 Cool Zone locations is included in Appendix F.

In 2025, the Cool Zone Program did not result in any CARE or FERA program enrollments or recertifications, though program education and enrollment assistance is provided at Cool Zone related outreach events.

### **CBO Outreach & Engagement**

In 2025, over 200 outreach activities, including promotion on social media (Facebook, X, Instagram, etc.), events, and presentations, were utilized to promote the Cool Zone Program by community-based organizations (CBOs) within SDG&E’s Energy Solutions Partner Network, and other community partners. SDG&E’s Communications team created pre-drafted social media posts for CBO partners to use and disseminate on their social media channels. These short messages accompanied with images make it easy for partners to select the messaging that best resonates with their audience on social media. These outreach activities reached an estimated audience of over 217,000 (see Appendix G).

Below are some examples of these activities shared through our CBOs:



### SDG&E Organic Social Media Promotion of Cool Zone Program

On August 8, SDG&E amplified awareness of San Diego County’s Cool Zones through targeted social media outreach, helping customers stay safe and reduce energy use during extreme heat. The campaign included posts on Facebook and Instagram, followed by two reshared updates on August 21. Performance metrics show strong engagement on Facebook with 712 impressions, 14 engagements, and a 1.96% engagement rate—well above the industry average of 0.09%. Instagram generated 1,380 impressions and 9 engagements, achieving a 0.65% engagement rate compared to the 1.60% industry benchmark. These efforts reflect our commitment to promoting community resources and driving customer engagement during critical weather events.

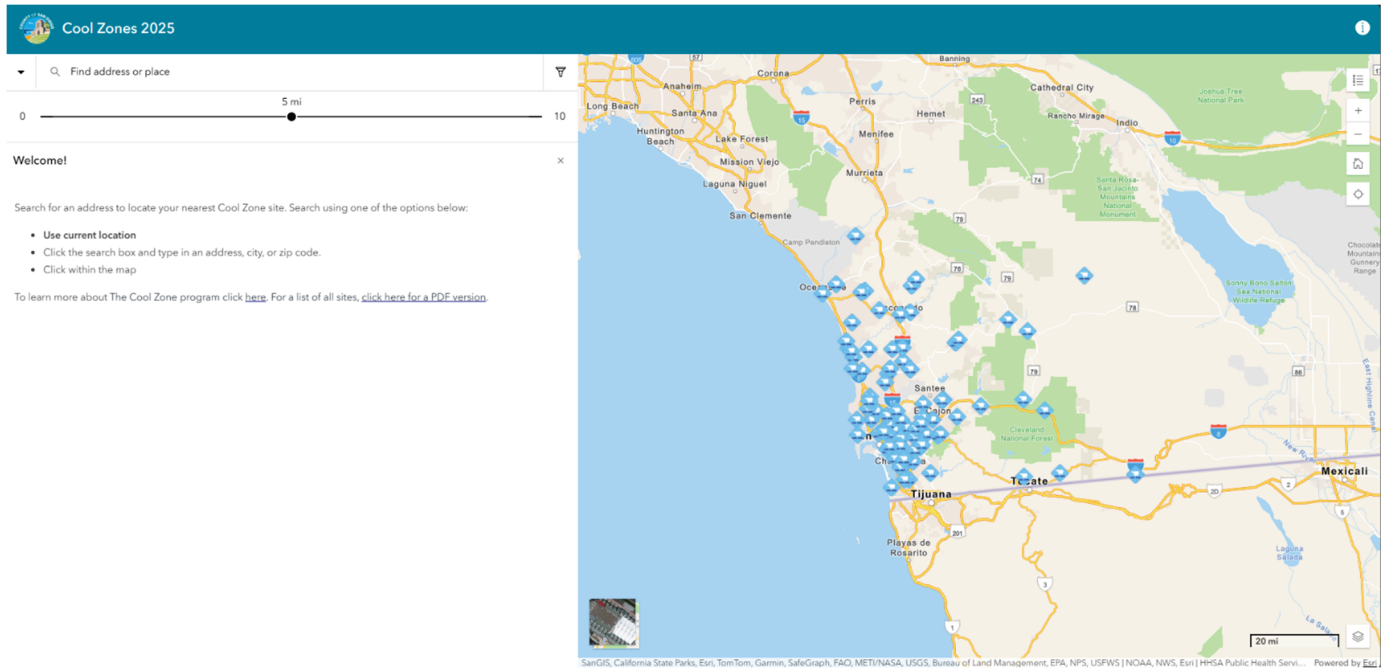

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## Medical Baseline Application

For Enrollment and Recertification

San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) is dedicated to providing safe and reliable energy to those who depend on life support equipment or special environmental conditions. The Medical Baseline Allowance Program helps customers save every month on their energy bill.

### What is the Medical Baseline Allowance Program?

The Medical Baseline Allowance Program provides an additional amount of gas and electricity at the lowest rates for residential customers. It is not a discount or rebate. In addition to your standard baseline allocation, the allowance received with the program is 16.5 kWh of electricity per day or 0.822 therms of natural gas per day, or both.

### What qualifies as life support?

A qualifying life support device is any medical device used to sustain life or is relied upon for mobility. This device must run on gas or electricity supplied by SDG&E or a Community Choice Aggregator. It includes, but is not limited to, respirators (oxygen concentrators), iron lungs, hemodialysis machines, suction machines, electric nerve stimulators, pressure pads and pumps, aerosol tents, electrostatic and ultrasonic nebulizers, compressors, IPPB machines, kidney dialysis machines and motorized wheelchairs. **Devices used for therapy rather than life support do not qualify.**

### Who is eligible?

Anyone with a qualifying medical need can apply for the allowance. You can also apply even if you pay for your energy through your landlord or property owner. If your landlord or property owner provides your energy bill, that bill will have the additional allowance.

### Customer contact information

For your safety, it's important we have your correct contact information in case of an outage or emergency. To check or update your contact information, log into **MyEnergyCenter.com** (on the home page, click on your profile name in top right corner and then click on "My Profile") or call **1-800-411-7343**.

While we do our best to avoid outages, we cannot guarantee that the power will always be on. Outages happen. SDG&E will attempt to notify the patient in advance of a state-directed power outage. **However, if the patient requires life support equipment, he/she should make arrangements for a backup power supply in case of an outage.**

3. If the resident has a visual disability, you may contact SDG&E to request special notification when either a self-certification form or renewal application with a licensed Medical Practitioner's certification form is mailed.
4. SDG&E cannot guarantee uninterrupted gas and electric service and you are responsible for making alternate arrangements in the event of a gas or electric outage.

You authorize SDG&E to share your information regarding your participation in SDG&E's Medical Baseline Allowance Program, including, without limitation, your name, address, contact information, circuit data, Medical Baseline Allowance Program enrollment status and medical equipment needs as described in this form if requested by emergency services professionals and agencies at the city, county, state and federal level for the purposes of managing de-energizations and to allow such parties to plan for and manage emergency situations.
