RE: Easton Telecom Services, L.L.C. Nomadic Interconnected Voice over Internet Protocol  
Service Registration

Dear Communications Division:

Pursuant to Decision 24-11-003,<sup>1</sup> Easton Telecom Services, L.L.C. (“Easton”) submits to the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission), the attached Communications Division *Registration Form Pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 1013* (Registration). By its registration, Easton requests a certificate of public convenience and necessity to provide non-facilities based Digital Voice Fixed (DVF) interconnected Voice over Internet Protocol (iVoIP) services in California. A \$250.00 Registration Fee is being contemporaneously submitted to the California Public Utilities Commission’s Fiscal Office via expedited delivery with this transmittal.

In conjunction with its registration and in the interest of administrative efficiency and expediency, Easton respectfully requests that when its Registration is granted, its assigned Digital Voice Fixed (DVF) Utility ID Number be discarded and that the Commission update its records to reflect the change by adding the DVF utility type into Easton’s wireline Utility ID Number, as if Easton had previously registered with the Commission as a digital voice services (iVoIP) provider prior to release of Commission Decision 24-11-003.<sup>2</sup> In support of its request, Easton states as follows.

On June 5, 2003, the Commission granted Easton’s application for certificate of public convenience and necessity under Pub. Util. Code § 1001.<sup>3</sup> Easton was assigned corporate (Utility) identification number U- 6778-C. Easton has since focused on the provision of wireline telecommunications services in California. With the advancement of iVoIP technology and growth of its California market, Easton now seeks to provide iVoIP services to existing and new California subscribers, where it had not been previously situated to do so.

Pursuant to the Decision 24-11-003,<sup>4</sup>

After the completion of the migration process, providers with a DVF utility type may request approval to discard the Utility ID Number associated with the DVF utility type designation by filing a Tier 2 advice letter. Upon approval, Communications Division staff will update Commission records to reflect the change, including deactivating the provider's Utility ID Number (*i.e.*, the one originally issued through the Section 285 registration process that underwent the migration) and adding the DVF utility type into the wireline Utility ID Number. After the consolidation, the provider will continue to operate under the remaining Utility ID Number and attendant obligations.

Easton acknowledges that the cited DVF Utility ID Number consolidation provisions in Decision 24-11-003 apply to those entities that held certificates of public convenience and necessity and registered as DVS provider prior to November 2024. As a long-standing holder of a certificate of public convenience and necessity to provide wireline telecommunications services in California, Easton's strategic decision to delay its provision of iVoIP services in California at this time should not preclude consideration of its request and be addressed as if Easton had registered as a DVS provider prior to November 2024.

Easton's request to add the DVF utility type into Easton's wireline Utility ID Number at the time that its application is granted is purely an administrative measure and undertaken solely for purposes of administrative efficiency and expediency. The request is intended to streamline the Commission's recordkeeping regarding Easton's ongoing regulatory obligations and to obviate the need for duplicative submission of wireline and DVF public policy program reports upon approval of Easton's application. No countervailing purpose or regulatory benefit would be served by delaying action on Easton's request or by requiring the filing of a separate, identical request subsequent to approval of its application pending a subsequent request.
