MOTION FOR PARTY STATUS OF ANTORA ENERGY, INC.

I. Introduction

In accordance with Rule 1.4(a)(4) of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the California Public Utilities Commission (the “Commission”), Antora Energy, Inc. (“Antora”) respectfully submits this motion requesting party status in the above captioned proceeding.

II. Interest in this Proceeding

A. Description of Antora

Antora manufactures and deploys thermal energy storage (TES) systems to power always-on industrial operations with clean, low-cost energy. Factory-built in San Jose, California, Antora’s modular thermal batteries deliver reliable and cost-effective heat and power for industrial and data center loads of any size.

Antora’s thermal batteries store low-cost electricity as heat in insulated blocks of solid carbon. This heat is then delivered around-the-clock to drive industrial processes or is converted into electricity. Instead of relying on supply-constrained critical minerals, Antora’s thermal batteries use safe and abundant materials, including from domestic suppliers across a dozen U.S. states.

B. Interest in the Proceeding

Antora will inform the Commission's decision-making, including providing information on thermal energy storage and the role it can play in California's energy market. Specifically, Antora will highlight the resource adequacy solutions that thermal energy storage can provide, and the policies and regulations needed to ensure robust long-duration energy storage deployment in the state.
