**ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S RULING ADMITTING
PREPARED EXHIBITS INTO THE EVIDENTIARY
RECORD AND GRANTING MOTION TO SEAL**

The parties jointly submitted a timely Motion to Admit Evidence into the Record on May 15, 2026 Joint Motion.¹ The Joint Motion seeks admission of testimony and exhibits of the Settling Parties that have been previously served, but have not previously been admitted into evidence by Decision (D.) 26-02-041 issued on March 2, 2026.² In addition to previously served testimony and exhibits, Cal Advocates and CFBF seek to admit additional materials into the record that they believe are necessary for the Commission's consideration.

Specifically, the Joint Motion requests the exhibits and testimony previously served addressing Net Power Cost (NPC), revenue requirement, rate spread and rate design, and the California allocation of

Washington Climate Commitment Act (CCA) compliance costs. In addition, Cal Advocates requests the admission of two items: (1) the 2020 PacifiCorp Inter-Jurisdictional Allocation Protocol; and (2) a Concise Explanatory Statement Chapter 173-446 WAC Climate Commitment Act Program. CFBF requests the admission of a data request and the response of PacifiCorp regarding the actual recorded costs incurred by PacifiCorp for 2025 Washington CCA compliance costs.

The requested relief is appropriate, and the above exhibits listed in Table 1 are hereby marked, identified, and received into the evidentiary record. It is reasonable to grant

PacifiCorp's motion for confidential treatment and identify the information in Table 2 as confidential during the pendency of this proceeding and then for a period of three years from the date of the decision closing this proceeding.

During this period, information subject to confidential treatment shall not be publicly disclosed except on further Commission order or Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) ruling. If any party believes that it is necessary for this information to remain under seal for longer than three years, it may file a new motion showing good cause for extending confidential treatment by not later than 30 days before the expiration of this confidentiality treatment.
