PROGRAM REPORT FOR SECOND QUARTER OF 2026**

WestLight Energy, formerly known as Peninsula Clean Energy Authority (“PCEA”), submits its Disadvantaged Communities Green Tariff (“DAC-GT”) quarterly report in accordance with Resolution E-4999, issued June 3, 2019. Ordering Paragraph (“OP”) 1(f) of Resolution E-4999 states:

“Once an IOU has completed its first RFO or initiated customer enrollment, whichever occurs first, within 30 Calendar Days after the end of each calendar quarter, PG&E, SCE, and SDG&E shall file a report in R.14-07-002, or a successor proceeding, and serve the same report on that service list, for the previous quarter and cumulatively, with the following minimum information for the DAC-GT and CSGT programs: capacity procured, capacity online, and customers subscribed. The quarterly reports should also identify the DACs in which DAC-GT or CSGT project is located and list the number of customers participating in each program in each DAC within a utility’s service territory. Finally, the quarterly reports must include the number of customers who have successfully enrolled in CARE and

FERA in the process of signing up for the DAC-GT or CSGT programs.”¹

As program administrators, Community Choice Aggregators (“CCAs”) are subject to the same reporting requirements as investor-owned utilities. Pursuant Rule 16.6 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure, on July 29, 2026, WestLight Energy submitted an extension request to the Executive Director seeking a one business-day extension to submit its quarterly report. Accordingly, WestLight Energy hereby submits a quarterly report covering the period of April 1, 2026, to June 30, 2026 attached hereto as Attachment A.

ATTACHMENT A

QUARTERLY DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES GREEN TARIFF PROGRAM REPORT FOR SECOND QUARTER 2026 OF WESTLIGHT ENERGY

Pursuant to Decision (“D.”) 18-06-027, *Alternate Decision Adopting Alternatives to Promote Solar Distributed Generation in Disadvantaged Communities*, issued on June 22, 2018, and in accordance with Resolution E-4999, issued on June 3, 2019 (“Resolution”), WestLight Energy (“WestLight”) submits its Disadvantaged Communities Green Tariff (“DAC-GT”) quarterly report.¹

On June 7, 2024, the Commission issued D.24-05-065 (“Decision”) which made several modifications to the DAC-GT and CSGT programs. The Decision discontinued the CSGT programs, and any program capacity was consolidated into the DAC-GT program.⁶ The Decision also allocated additional DAC-GT program capacity.⁷ As a result of these two modifications, PCE's DAC-GT program capacity increased from 3.37 MW to 6.008 MW.

WestLight’s DAC-GT program (branded as WestLight’s “Green Access” program) provides a 20% bill discount to low-income customers, defined as customers eligible for California Alternate Rates for Energy Program (“CARE”) or Family Electric Rate Assistance Program (“FERA”), located in Disadvantaged Communities (“DACs”), defined as the top 25% most impacted census tracts statewide using the CalEnviroScreen tool, along with other areas in the highest 5% of CalEnviroScreen’s Pollution Burden.²

Table 1 below summarizes the following information for each program, as of the final date in the Reporting Period: (1) the total procured and online solar project capacity, (2) the DACs in which projects are located, (3) customer enrollment count, and (4) customer enrollments in the CARE or FERA programs that occurred as a result of DAC-GT enrollment.

Tables 2 and 3 indicate project details for WestLight’s DAC-GT program. On November 22, 2021, WestLight launched its first DAC-GT RFO, which closed on January 31, 2022. WestLight subsequently entered into a 20-year Power Purchase agreement for a new 3.0 MWac solar resource to serve the DAC-GT program.⁷ The new resource, referred to as Dos Palos Clean Power, came online in March 2025. WestLight will continue to leverage existing interim resources to supply the balance of PCE’s 6.008 MW DAC-GT capacity until additional permanent resources can be procured.

WestLight issued a DAC-GT RFO in Q4 2025 seeking a new 3MW resource. On July 23, 2026, WestLight’s Board of Directors approved a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with Renewable America for a new 3MW Solar 12/MWh Battery Energy Storage System with an expected Commercial Operation Date of December 31, 2028.
