**MOTION OF THE LANDLINE COMPANY FOR LEAVE TO FILE CONFIDENTIAL
INFORMATION UNDER SEAL [TOGETHER WITH PROPOSED] ALJ RULING
GRANTING THE LANDLINE COMPANY MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE
CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION UNDER SEAL**

I. Introduction

Pursuant to Rule 11.1 and 11.4 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, The Landline Company ("Applicant") respectfully requests leave to file under seal **Exhibit G** to the above-entitled Application.

II. Relief Requested

On March 18, 2026, Applicant filed its application (the "Application") requesting a certificate of public convenience and necessity to establish and operate as a passenger stage corporation to provide scheduled passenger stage service for the transportation between Charles M. Schulz-Sonoma County Airport (STS) and San Francisco International Airport (SFO), open to the general public.

In accordance with Rule 2.3, Applicant is required to include with the Application its financial information in the application by providing its financial statements. The required financial statements contain Applicant's confidential information. An unredacted version of the financial statements (**Exhibit G** to the Application) has been submitted under seal in the attachment to this motion pending the Commission's ruling on this request.

By way of the Application, Applicant is requesting authority to establish and operate as a passenger stage corporation in a highly competitive environment. Public disclosure of Applicant's confidential information contained in the financial statements will place Applicant in a position of disadvantage to its competitors operating in the service area. In addition, publication of that information may harm the public interest as an impairment to fair

competition, as well as being detrimental to the interest of Applicant. On the other hand, no real public interest will be served by enabling free public disclosure of Applicant's financial information. Therefore, Applicant submits that confidential treatment of its identified financial statements is authorized under the public interest balancing test of Government Code § 6255(a).

Pursuant to Section 583 of the Public Utilities Code and General Order No. 66-D, the Commission may order confidential information submitted to the Commission to be sealed and not open to public inspection, and Applicant submits that sufficient good cause exists for the Commission to issue such an order in this instance.

Wherefore, Applicant respectfully requests the Commission grant this motion and issue a protective order as described herein.

**[PROPOSED] ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE’S RULING GRANTING THE
LANDLINE COMPANY’S MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE
CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION UNDER SEAL**

I. INTRODUCTION

On March 20, 2026, Landline Company (“Applicant”) filed a motion for leave to file certain confidential information under seal. This Ruling grants the relief requested.

II. RELIEF REQUESTED

On March 20, 2026, Applicant filed application requesting a certificate of public convenience and necessity to establish and operate as a passenger stage corporation to provide scheduled, city-to-city bus service for the transportation of passengers between Charles M. Schulz-Sonoma County Airport (STS) and San Francisco International Airport (SFO). The proposed service will consist of direct, airport-to-airport passenger transportation open to the general public.

In accordance with Rule 3.3(a)(8) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedures, The Landline Company’s application is required to include a statement of financial ability to render the proposed service. Evidence of financial ability is to be shown through financial statement including a balance sheet and income statement. The financial statement contains sensitive information related to Applicant’s operations. Public dissemination of Applicant’s financial statement could provide Applicant with an advantage based upon their knowledge of Applicant’s financial ability.

Based on these assertions, Applicant’s motion requests leave under Section 583 of the Public Utilities Code and CPUC General Order No. 66-C to file the financial statement under

The Landline Company's request that the referenced information be filed under seal pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 583 and General Order 66-C is reasonable and supported by the facts and therefore is **GRANTED**.
