**CPUC TO HOLD HEARINGS TO RECEIVE
PUBLIC COMMENT ON EDISON RATE CASE**

SAN FRANCISCO, March 21, 2017 - The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) is holding Public Participation Hearings to obtain comment from the public about Southern California Edison's (SCE) request to increase rates and revenue by \$222 million by January 2018, an additional increase of \$533 million in 2019, and \$570 million in 2020. SCE's revenue increase request is referred to as a General Rate Case (GRC), and it covers costs to operate SCE and deliver power to customers. It does not cover SCE's cost to purchase fuel to operate its generators, or costs to purchase power from other companies. If SCE's request is approved by the CPUC, SCE's revenue requirement will be \$5.885 billion in 2018, a 5.5 percent increase over the



currently authorized amount.

If the CPUC approves SCE's request, the impact on residential customers who use the system-wide average of 600 kilowatt-hours per month would be approximately \$3.75 a month in 2018. In 2019, the monthly increase would be approximately \$5.65, and in 2020 the monthly increase would be approximately \$7.29.

Consumers are encouraged to attend Public Participation Hearings, as comments from the public can help the CPUC reach an informed decision.
