RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION ALJ-351. Resolves K.17-11-012, the Appeal of London Rose Tours LLC from Citation F-5380 issued on October 31, 2017 by the Transportation Enforcement Section of the Consumer Protection and Enforcement Division.

SUMMARY

This resolution resolves K.17-11-012, the Appeal of London Rose Tours LLC (London Rose) from Citation F-5380 issued on October 31, 2017, by the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission), Transportation Enforcement Section of the Consumer Protection and Enforcement Division (CPED) for violations of the Public Utilities Code Sections and General Order 157-D. On November 27, 2017, London Rose timely filed an appeal. On December 6, 2017, CPED timely filed its compliance filing. An appeal hearing was scheduled for January 23, 2018.

BACKGROUND

On January 12, 2018, the Consumer Protection and Enforcement Division (CPED) submitted a written request to withdraw the instant appeal upon reaching a mutually agreeable settlement with CPED. The e-mail was sent upon the consent of Hector Ocegueda, representing London Rose.¹ On January 24, 2017, Mr. Ocegueda confirmed by e-mail that he wished to withdraw the appeal because he reached an agreeable settlement with CPED.

The Commission regulates charter-party carriers of passengers primarily pursuant to the Passenger Charter-Party Carriers' Act (Pub. Util. Code § 5351, et seq.) Pursuant to Resolution ALJ-187, issued by the Commission on September 22, 2005, CPED is authorized to issue citations to various classes of transportation carriers for violation of the Public Utilities Code and/or Commission orders. In turn, a carrier issued such a

citation may accept the fine imposed or contest it through a process of appeal under Resolution ALJ-299.²

The citation appeal of London Rose Tours from Citation F-5380 issued on October 31, 2017 by the Transportation Enforcement Section of the Consumer Protection and Enforcement Division should be dismissed because there are no remaining issues for the Commission to resolve.

SAFETY

The Commission has broad authority to regulate charter-party carriers, particularly with regard to safety concerns. (*See* for example, Pub. Util. Code § 451, 5382 and 5387.) The citation appeal process allows the Commission to provide due process and ensure charter-party carriers are meeting their regulatory requirements.

COMMENTS

The draft resolution of Administrative Law Judge MacDonald in this matter was mailed in accordance with Section 311 of the Public Utilities Code and Rule 14.5 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. Comments were served on _____, and reply comments were served on _____ by ____.

- 1. The Appeal of London Rose Tours LLC from Citation F-5380 issued on October 31, 2017 is dismissed with prejudice.
- 2. This proceeding is closed.
