**CPUC TO HOLD PUBLIC FORUMS ON EDISON'S RATE REQUEST**

SAN FRANCISCO, February 12, 2018 - The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) will hold public forums to provide an opportunity for customers of Southern California Edison to offer their perspective and input to the CPUC about the company's rate request, as follows:

Consumers are encouraged to attend these Public Participation Hearings, as comments from the public can help the CPUC reach an informed decision. Customer service representatives from Edison will be available to assist with any customer billing and/or service questions at these events.

This proceeding is referred to as Phase 2 of Edison's 2018 General Rate Case. The primary purpose of the proceeding is for Edison to assign revenues to its customers, and adjust rate designs to recover those revenues. While this proceeding will not increase or decrease overall revenues, residential customers will see an increase in rates if the changes proposed by Edison are adopted. To reduce the impact to higher-usage residential customers, Edison is proposing an increase in the baseline allowance. This will provide more electricity at the lowest priced rate (i.e., Tier 1). Revenue changes will be determined in separate proceedings and will be taken into account before the CPUC



concludes this proceeding. The rate design the CPUC ultimately adopts will incorporate those revenue requirement changes. The Phase 2 revisions are estimated to change rates for customers in the first quarter of 2019.
