CPUC TO HOLD PUBLIC FORUMS ON SDG&E'S RATE REQUESTS

SAN FRANCISCO, August 6, 2019 - The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) will hold public forums for customers to give their perspective and input to the CPUC about San Diego Gas & Electric's (SDG&E) rate requests, as follows:

Public Forum

The public forums, called Public Participation Hearings, will begin with a brief overview of SDG&E's request; then public comments will be heard. The CPUC Administrative Law Judge assigned to this proceeding is scheduled to write a Proposed Decision in the case for CPUC Commissioner consideration by August 2020.

The CPUC welcomes attendance and comment on SDG&E's request at these public forums, as public comments will help the CPUC reach an informed decision.



Application (A.) 19-03-002

This proceeding is known as Phase 2 of SDG&E's 2019 General Rate Case. On March 24, 2019, SDG&E submitted an application to the CPUC requesting approval to update its electric marginal costs, revenue cost allocation, and rate design.

Application (A.) 10-07-009

On April 26, 2019, SDG&E filed a petition for modification of [Decision 12-12-004](#) requesting approval to modify the default electric rate for its small commercial customers from time-of-use (TOU) with critical peak pricing to TOU without critical peak pricing. The scope of this proceeding focuses on, among other things, questions of fact that are related to the CPUC's consideration of SDG&E's proposals in A.19-03-002.

While a quorum of Commissioners and/or their staff may attend, no official action will be taken on this matter at the public forums.
