CPUC TO HOLD MEETING ON WILDFIRE RISK ANALYSIS RESULTS

SAN FRANCISCO, March 12, 2021 - The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), as part of its ongoing oversight of utility Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) events, will hold a public meeting to present risk analysis results that estimate what the potential fire damage impacts could have been if electric utility infrastructure had remained energized during 2019 PSPS events.

WHAT: Public meeting on risk analysis by CPUC contractor, Technosylva, on wildfire risk analysis results

WHEN: March 26, 2021, 9 a.m. - Noon

WHERE: Remote access via webcast or conference line. Participation information is below

WHY: The CPUC engaged Technosylva to use its wildfire modeling capabilities to estimate the potential fire impacts during the 2019 PSPS events if utility electric lines had not been de-energized and there was an ignition.
