#### I. INTRODUCTION

Cal Am requests a \$15,295,341 revenue requirement (budget) for its affiliate, American Water Works Service Company (Service Company) for Test Year (TY) 2024. L 2 As an American Water Works Company (American Water) subsidiary, 3 the reasonableness of its expenses is evaluated as a company that provides services for companies in addition to Cal Am.

#### II. SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS

The Commission should reduce the Service Company labor budget, based solely on the requested 14.3% reduction in labor, by \$1,242,344. Other Cal Advocate witnesses' recommendations further decrease the Service Company budget.

#### III. DISCUSSION

General Office costs are comprised of two categories: Service Company costs and Cal Corp costs. Service Company costs are addressed in this testimony and Cal Corp (General Office) costs are evaluated by Cal Advocates' witness Mr. Andrew Sweeney. The Commission should make an adjustment to Cal Am's TY 2024 budget for Service Company to account for the Service Company's labor reduction.

Cal Am requests a 14.3% reduction in Service Company labor, from the last authorized full-time equivalent employees of 60.1 down to 51.5 in Test Year 2024. Cal Am's requested Service Company budget does not consider its requested reductions in labor. It is not reasonable to merely inflate the past authorized revenue without considering the reduction in requested labor. Therefore, the Commission should reduce the Service Company labor budget by 14.3% to reflect reduction in Service Company labor. This recommendation reduces Cal Am's requested Service Company budget by \$1,242,344. Any other differences in Cal Am's requested Service Company budget are the result of Cal Advocates' other witnesses' recommendations.

#### IV. CONCLUSION

The Commission should reduce Cal Am's requested Service Company labor budget for TY 2024 by \$1,242,344. Other Cal Advocate witnesses' recommendations further reduce Cal Am's requested Service Company budget.
