The Telecommunications Division staff (staff) will conduct a workshop pursuant to Commission Decision (D.) 02-06-072 in Rulemaking 02-02-020. D.02-06-072 implemented the current acceptable 3% error rate for telephone connections made by predictive dialers (PDs) for which no agent or telemarketer is available to speak to the person called. By D.02-06-072 the Commission also established related, interim record-keeping requirements. The workshop will address: 1) further requirements for record-keeping on these PD connections; 2) methods for educating consumers about do-not-call registers and other means to discourage unwanted calls; 3) the feasibility of accomplishing the 1% acceptable error rate in PD use that is scheduled to become the new standard on January 1, 2003, and; 4) whether a revised acceptable error rate for PD use should be made effective January 1, 2003, or on some later date.
