Ruiz seeking disclosure of Commission staff investigative records relating to an electric incident in which Mr. Timothy John Ruiz was killed on November 5, 2002, when he was electrocuted while working on a San Diego Gas & Electric Company transmission tower, number Z96238, in Kearney Mesa, California.
