On April 6, 2001, the draft resolution was circulated to the parties on the service list of the proceeding in which General Order 131-D was adopted, Order Instituting Investigation 83-04-03, and to the California Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission, pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 311(g) and Rules 77.7 and 81 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.
