Pursuant to the Assigned Commissioner's Ruling and Scoping Memo, filed January 6, 2009 and Administrative Law Judge Kenney's January 28, 2009 Ruling Rescheduling Workshops, on February 17 and 18, 2009, the Commission's Consumer Protection and Safety Division (CPSD) will be conducting its second two-day workshop in order to propose to the Commission clarifications or additional rules designed to reduce fire hazards involving electric lines or communications facilities near electric lines, so that these measures can be adopted and implemented by autumn, 2009.
